# Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)

- Any behaviour that causes, or is likely to cause, harassment, alarm or distress to any person.
- It can also be described as a range of unacceptable activity that causes harm to the community or the environment.
- This can include but not limited to; noise nuisance, verbal abuse, threatening behaviour, harassment, vandalism, fire setting, use of vehicles and can take place in private or public places.
