Joint Report by Head of Finance & Director (Environment)

PURPOSE OF REPORT

This report details the Income and Expenditure to 31 January 2016 and the projected outturn to 31 March 2016 for the Pitlochry Common Good Fund.

1. BACKGROUND / MAIN ISSUES

1.1 This report provides the monitoring position and projected outturn for the Financial Year 2015/16.

2. PROPOSALS

2.1 Financial Statement 2015/16

On the basis of Appendix 1, it is anticipated that a surplus of £20 will be generated in 2015/16 and the Fund's Revenue Account Balance will be £7,199 at 31 March 2016.

2.2 <u>2016/17 Budget</u>

The Financial Assistance criteria for the disbursement of Common Good Funds has been reviewed and will be considered by Committee at this meeting. The Pitlochry Common Good Fund has limited resources available to meet requests for Financial Assistance funding. It is therefore proposed that no budget is set for 2016/17 and that the Committee will consider future funding requests in line with the revised Financial Assistance criteria.

3. CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATIONS

- 3.1 The Committee is requested to:-
 - (i) Note the Income & Expenditure to 31 January 2016 and the projected outturn for Financial Year 2015/16, as detailed within Appendix 1.
 - (ii) Approve that future funding applications will be considered in line with the updated Financial Assistance criteria and that no budget will be set for 2016/17.
