## **Applications for Financial Assistance**

## Report by Depute Chief Executive (Report No. 18/309)

The report asks Auchterarder Common Good Fund Committee to consider two applications for financial assistance from Auchterarder Community Sports Association and the Auchterarder and Blackford Brownies.

### 1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1. Perth and Kinross Council owns land and property which forms part of the Common Good of the former burghs in Perth & Kinross and has a statutory duty in terms of section 15 of the Local Government etc. (Scotland) Act 1994 to administer this land and property "having regard to the interests of the inhabitants" of those former burghs. This duty also applies to the administration of the associated Common Good Funds.
- 1.2. Local residents and organisations can apply to Common Good Funds for support to develop projects in the Common Good area. These grants allow individuals and local organisations to carry out a wide range of community based activities. Retrospective applications are not accepted. However, if an application is received before the project takes place and cannot be considered at the following meeting because papers have already been issued, the application will be considered at the next meeting even if the activities have taken place. Therefore, the Committee decision will only be known after the activities have taken place, and if the grant is not awarded, the applicant will have to fund the activities from its own funds.
- 1.3. The 2018/19 Financial Assistance budget for Auchterarder Common Good Fund was approved by this Committee at the meeting on 25 April 2018. The approved budget and the value of requested Financial Assistance funding to be considered by Committee at this meeting is summarised below:

1.4. The value of funding to be considered at this meeting is in excess of the remaining Financial Assistance budget. In the event that the Committee approves funding in excess of the remaining budget for the year, an option open to the Committee, the budgeted £9,500 surplus for the year will reduce accordingly. In addition, funding awards which total in excess of £19,500 for the year may result in a reduction in the overall Revenue Account balance of the Fund. The 2018/19 Financial Statement report to be considered at this meeting provides details of the approved budget, estimated income and expenditure for the year, the Revenue Account balance at 1 April 2018, and the estimated Revenue Account balance at 31 March 2019 for the Fund.

#### 2. PROPOSALS

## **Auchterarder Community Sports Association**

- 2.1. An application has been received from Auchterarder Community Sports Association, seeking a grant towards the costs of Phase 3 of the Auchterarder Core Path Project. The total costs amount to £552,100. Other successful sources of funding are Sustrans (£276,050) and Evolution Bioscience Scotland (£50,000). Other pending sources of funding are Auchterarder Community Facilities Fund (£75,000), Suez Community Trust (£50,000), Land Trust (£50,000), Clackmannanshire and Stirling Environment Trust (£20,000) and Auchterarder Community Trust (£11,000). The applicant is applying for £20,000. The applicant has previously benefitted from the Fund, in 2016/17 (£50,000) and 2017/18 (£50,000).
- 2.2. The grant will deliver a 1,100 metre section of the Provost Walk that is fully Disability Discrimination Act compliant and suitable for walkers, cyclists, prams and people with impairments.

### **Auchterarder and Blackford Brownies**

- 2.3. An application has been received from the Auchterarder and Blackford Brownies, seeking a grant towards the cost of a Trip to Paris 2019. The total costs amount to £8,188. Other pending sources of funding are Trefoil Guild (£2,724) and Strathearn and Strathallan Decides (£1,500). The applicant is applying for £1,000. The applicant has not previously benefitted from the Fund.
- 2.4. The grant will allow the Brownies to go on an international trip, thereby making them more likely to continue with girl-guiding.

#### 3. RECOMMENDATION

## Report by Head of Finance (Report No. 18/310)

#### **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

This report provides an update on Income and Expenditure to 31 August 2018 and the projected outturn to 31 March 2019 for the Auchterarder Common Good Fund.

#### 1. BACKGROUND / MAIN ISSUES

The Committee approved the Auchterarder Common Good Fund budget at the meeting of the 25 April 2018 (Report 18/144 refers). This report provides an update on the monitoring position and projected outturn for the Financial Year 2018/19.

#### 2. PROPOSALS

#### Financial Statement 2018/19

- 2.1 On the basis of Appendix 1, it is anticipated that there will be a surplus of £9,500 in Financial Year 2018/19 and the Fund's Revenue Account Balance is estimated to be £294,018 at 31 March 2019.
- 2.2 The Financial Assistance report to be considered at this meeting includes two applications for funding; and the value of funding award is to be determined by the Committee. The projected uncommitted Revenue Account closing balance assumes that approved funding will be contained within the 2018/19 Financial Assistance budget. Any funding award in excess of the budget for the year, an option open to the committee, will result in a reduction in the overall balance of the fund.
