#### PURPOSE OF REPORT

This report recommends that the List of Public Roads be updated to take account of the additions detailed in this report.

## 1. BACKGROUND / MAIN ISSUES

- 1.1 The Roads (Scotland) Act, 1984, requires the Council to keep a List of Public Roads, which it has a duty to manage and maintain. The Act makes provision for new or upgraded sections of road to be added to the List from time to time.
- 1.2 The roads detailed in the attached schedule were partially constructed under Construction Consent, however the developer ceased trading before they were completed. The Council completed the roads in accordance with Section 17 of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984, and is obliged to add them to its List of Public Roads.

#### 2. PROPOSALS

2.1 It is proposed to amend the List of Public Roads as detailed in the attached schedule.

# 3. CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATION(S)

3.1 The roads detailed in the attached schedule have been completed to the required standards and now require to be added to the List of Public Roads.


