Report by Head of Cultural and Community Services (Report No. 23/254)

1. PURPOSE

1.1 The report asks Kinross Common Good Fund Committee to consider two grant applications for financial assistance.

2. **RECOMMENDATION**

- 2.1 It is recommended that Committee:

4. BACKGROUND / MAIN ISSUES

- 4.1 Perth and Kinross Council owns land and property which forms part of the Common Good of the former burghs in Perth and Kinross and has a statutory duty in terms of section 15 of the Local Government etc. (Scotland) Act 1994 to administer this land and property "having regard to the interests of the inhabitants" of those former burghs. This duty also applies to the administration of the associated Common Good Funds.
- 4.2 The Common Good Funds have traditionally demonstrated their support to local residents and organisations by distributing grants. These grant awards allow individuals and local organisations to carry out a wide range of community-based activities.
- 4.3 Applications to Common Good Funds vary across the different former burghs of Perth and Kinross. This report is for the Kinross Common Good Fund.
- 4.4 A summary of the projected surplus, committed grant funding, and the

surplus remaining, is provided below:

5. **PROPOSALS – SMALL GRANTS**

Light Up Kinross

- 5.1 A grant of £1000 has been requested by Light Up Kinross. The grant would contribute towards financial support for their 25th Annual Christmas Lights from November to January.
- 5.2 The grant will be used to erect 62 streetlamp lights, fountain lights and 4 wall lights as well as a decorated Christmas tree in November and dismantle in January. This event will aim to brighten up the town of Kinross during the festive period, making it bright and cheerful for locals and visitors. Light Up Kinross also has support from Kinross-shire Local Events Organisation (KLEO) and local traders. The group estimates that 7,500 people from within the Common Good Area will benefit from the event throughout its duration, along with 950 from elsewhere in Perth & Kinross and 900 from outside of Perth & Kinross. These numbers are rough estimates, depending on the number of visitors to Kinross over the festive period. Success will be measured through feedback from members of the public.
- 5.3 The total cost of the project is estimated at £4,952, with the group contributing £1,038 towards the costs and has £2,000 pending from the Kinross-shire Fund. If the award from the Common Good Fund is granted, a funding gap of £914 would remain, which is expected to be covered through the support of local traders and the Community Newsletter. A full breakdown of the costs is provided below.

Consideration

Kinross-shire Volunteer Group and Rural Outreach Scheme (KVG)

- 5.6 An application for £390 has been received from KVG to go towards a Thank You Celebratory Event to be held on Sunday 1 October. KVG have been informed that they will be receiving an award from Age Scotland and have been given a budget of £500 to organise a local event for this purpose. KVG would like to enlarge the event and are seeking funding to help cover these additional costs. The event will be held in Orwell Church with catering provided by local provider Avant Garde.
- 5.7 KVG have been in operation for over 40 years, providing a local volunteer driver service to help people get to appointments and keep in touch with friends. This supports people to live independently and maintain social networks.
- 5.8 The Thank You Celebratory Event will directly benefit 60-65 people aged over 65 from the Common Good area including volunteers and some service users, which currently total around 300. Numbers are limited by venue size.
- 5.9 The total cost of the event is estimated to be £890, with £500 already in place from Age Scotland. A grant of £390 from Kinross Common Good Fund would complete the funding package. If funding is not awarded, the event will still go ahead, but at a smaller scale. A breakdown of costs is provided below:

Report by Head of Finance (Report No. 23/255)

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

This report provides the Committee with a statement of the unaudited Income and Expenditure for Financial Year 2022/23, and the projected Income and Expenditure for Financial Year 2023/24 for the Kinross Common Good Fund.

2. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

The Committee is requested to:

- Note the unaudited Income and Expenditure to the 31 March 2023 for the Kinross Common Good Fund for the 2022/23 Financial Year, as set out in Appendix 1 to the report.
- (ii) Note the projected Income and Expenditure to 31 March 2024 for the Kinross Common Good Fund for the 2023/24 Financial Year, as set out in Appendix 2 to the report.

3. BACKGROUND / MAIN ISSUES

3.1 This report provides an update on the unaudited outturn for Financial Year 2022/23, and the monitoring position for Financial Year 2023/24.

4. PROPOSALS

Financial Statement 2022/23

4.1 As detailed in Appendix 1, there is a surplus of £4,509 for the Fund for Financial Year 2022/23, and the unaudited Fund balance at 31 March 2023 is £161,660. The movement from the position previously reported to this Committee relates to financial assistance expenditure of £2,131, less prior year funding no longer required of £1,200, and an increase in interest earned on deposits. The Minimum Account Balance has been increased to £160,000 upon receipt of the proceeds from the sale of land at Myre Park as agreed on 18th August 2022.

Financial Statement 2023/24

- 4.2 On the basis of Appendix 2, the anticipated interest earned on deposits for 2023/24 is £6,100 and expenditure on financial assistance is estimated at £1,000.
- 4.3 The total estimated surplus for financial year 2023/24 is, therefore, £5,100 and the anticipated Fund balance at 31 March 2024 is £166,760.
- 4.4 There is one application for financial assistance which will be considered at this meeting. In the event that the value of any funding award exceeds the estimated income for the year, which is a decision open to the Committee, the Fund balance will reduce accordingly.
