PROPOSED 20 MPH SPEED LIMIT - GANNOCHY AREA, PERTH

Report by Depute Director (Environment)

PURPOSE OF REPORT

This report summarises the objection received during the advertising of the proposal to introduce a 20mph speed limit on the roads in and around the Gannochy area of Perth. The report recommends that the objection be set aside and the Order is made as advertised.

1. BACKGROUND / MAIN ISSUES

- 1.1 At its meeting on 30 January 2013 this Committee agreed to promote a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) to introduce a permanent 20mph in and around the Gannochy area of Perth. The proposals are shown in Appendix 1.
- 1.2 A resident has objected to the proposal on the grounds that without installing other traffic measures to accompany the speed limit it will not have any effect and suggests that road humps should also be installed.

2. PROPOSALS

- 2.1 The area has been assessed in accordance with the national guidance on speed limits and a 20mph speed limit is considered appropriate. It is hoped that the reduced speed limit will encourage lower vehicle speeds and discourage drivers from using this area as a "rat run". Additional measures such as road humps are not considered appropriate.
- 2.2 The Committee is therefore asked to set aside the objection received and to proceed to implement the TRO to introduce a 20mph speed limit in and around the Gannochy area of Perth as advertised

3. CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATION(S)

3.1 It is recommended that the Committee agree to set aside the objection and proceed with introducing the 20mph Speed Limit Order.
