## 4. BACKGROUND

- 4.1 The Finance and Resources Committee agreed in June 2023 to approve a revised Executive and Strategic Leadership Structure for the Council as part of the leadership review carried out by the Chief Executive. (Report 23/195 refers).
- 4.2 The Council's Scheme of Administration sets out levels of delegation in terms of decision-making to both Committees / Sub-Committees and also senior officers. As reported to Council in December 2023, the Strategic Lead Legal and Governance has now revised the Scheme to reflect the new senior leadership structure.

#### 5. PROPOSALS

5.1 Council is asked to approve the revised delegation to officials as part of the Scheme of Administration as set out in Appendix 1.
