CYCLING, WALKING AND SAFER STREETS (CWSS) PROJECTS 2012/13

Report by the Executive Director (Environment)

This report details the Cycling, Walking and Safer Streets Projects implemented in 2011/12, and seeks Committee approval for a list of works funded from Cycling, Walking and Safer Streets Grant 2012/13 of £172,000 from the Scottish Government.

1. RECOMMENDATIONS

1.1 The Committee is asked to:

- i) Note the schemes implemented from the Cycling, Walking and Safer Streets Grant Funding in 2011/12
- ii) Approve the proposed list of works for Cycling, Walking and Safer Streets projects for the financial year 2012/13
- iii) Note the applications for funding from the Sustrans Community Links 2012/13 Programme.

2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1 In 2011/12 the Scottish Ministers in exercise of their powers under Section 70 of the Transport (Scotland) Act 2001 offered Perth and Kinross a Capital Grant of £209,000 for Cycling, Walking and Safer Street (CWSS) projects. Details of how this was spent are given in paragraph 3 of this report.
- 2.2 In 2012/13 the Scottish Ministers, in exercise of the same powers, have offered Perth and Kinross Council a Capital Grant for CWSS projects of up to £172,000.
- 2.3 Transport Scotland expect the CWSS Grant to be used for the purpose of undertaking a programme of works for local cycling, walking and safer streets projects.
- 2.4 Included in the terms and conditions of the Grant is that local authorities shall consider a minimum spend of 36% (and preferably above 50%) on works and promotion relating to cycling. This approach was agreed by the COSLA Regeneration and Sustainable Development Executive Group on 5 February 2010.

3. Cycling, Walking and Safer Streets 2011/12

3.1 At its meetings on 8 June and 23 November 2011 (Arts 11/347 & 11/632) the Committee approved a list of works to be funded from the Council's Capital Grant of £209,000 for CWSS projects. Details of the schemes implemented are listed at Appendix 1.

3.2 Further to the outcome of consultations, and as designs progressed, it became apparent that some of the schemes could not be implemented as proposed. Full details are given in the table below.

3.3 In light of the changes above it was possible to fund another project from the CWSS Grant, as below.

Speed Limit Review	Design, manufacture and supply of speed limits signs	
Signs were designed and purchased and will be implement in 2012/13 using Revenue funding.		

3.4 It is highlighted that 54% of the 2011/12 Grant funding was spent on cycling works and the terms and conditions therefore met.

4. PROPOSALS

4.1 Cycling, Walking and Safer Streets 2012/13

- 4.1.1 Based on the terms and conditions of the Grant, the table in Appendix 2 details the schemes that have been identified for implementation in 2012/13. The associated plans are at Appendix 2.
- 4.1.2 It is anticipated that 7 of the 13 schemes will be match funded by Sustrans through their Community Links 2012/13 Programme. This Programme is one

- of Sustrans Scotland's grant schemes and is key to meeting the target of the Cycling Action Plan for Scotland, as it provides funding for the creation of cycling network infrastructure and tackles a barrier for new cyclists.
- 4.1.3 Site visits with a member of Sustrans have taken place and applications for funding were submitted in advance of the deadline of 11 May 2012. The outcome of our applications are likely to be known in July 2012, but it is highlighted that Sustrans have indicated that they will support the schemes as listed.
- 4.1.4 The list of schemes and the drawings as detailed in Appendix 2.
- 4.1.5 In line with the terms and conditions of the Grant in relation to spend on cycle related projects, it is proposed to implement a number of cycle projects as detailed above. These amount to £101,000 (59% of the Grant). The Council will therefore meet requirements on spend on cycle related projects.

5. CONSULTATION

- 5.1 The Head of Legal Services, the Head of Democratic Services, the Acting Head of Finance and Tayside Police have been consulted in the preparation of this report.
- 5.2 As part of the scheme design, consultation will be carried out with the relevant parties where appropriate, including the local Elected Members.

6. RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

- 6.1 Capital
- 6.1.2 Scottish Government has made available an additional Capital Grant of £172,000 to the Council for CWSS projects. The list of works recommended in this report will fully utilise this finance. An additional £95,000 of grant funding from Sustrans is also likely to be utilised.
- 6.2 Revenue
- 6.2.1 It is estimated that the Revenue commitments arising from the routine maintenance of traffic calming features, footways, cycle paths and traffic signing (£3,700) will be met from the Roads Maintenance budgets. These costs will require to be prioritised within the existing revenue budgets.

7. COUNCIL CORPORATE PLAN OBJECTIVES 2009-2012

- 7.1 The Council's Corporate Plan 2009-2012 lays out five Objectives which provide clear strategic direction, inform decisions at a corporate and service level and shape resources allocation. This report impacts on the following:-
 - (i) Safe, Secure and Welcoming Environment
 - (ii) A Prosperous, Sustainable and Inclusive Economy

8. EQUALITIES IMPACT ASSESSMENT (EqIA)

- 8.1 An equality impact assessment needs to be carried out for functions, policies, procedures or strategies in relation to race, gender and disability and other relevant protected characteristics. This supports the Council's legal requirement to comply with the duty to assess and consult on relevant new and existing policies.
- 8.2 The function, policy, procedure or strategy presented in this report was considered under the Corporate Equalities Impact Assessment process (EqIA) with the following outcome:
 - i) Assessed as **relevant** and no actions are required to be taken to reduce or remove negative impacts.
 - ii) Assessed as **relevant** and the following positive outcomes expected following implementation:
 - a) The measures, for example improved crossing facilities, footways and traffic calming features, will provide improved access for communities, and will particularly improve travel opportunities for disabled people with mobility issues, sight or hearing impairment, children, elderly people & parent/carers walking with children in pushchairs/buggies.
 - b) The measures will provide improvements for road users of all ages, but particularly for children and elderly people. This will include facilities to enable them to cross roads more safely.
 - c) The measures will also encourage children to walk or cycle to school, thus bringing health benefits.
 - d) The measures will provide opportunities for increased travel by foot and cycle for all age groups.

9. STRATEGIC ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT

- 9.1 Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) is a legal requirement under the Environmental Assessment (Scotland) Act 2005 that applies to all qualifying plans, programmes and strategies, including policies (PPS).
- 9.2 The matters presented in this report were considered under the Environmental Assessment (Scotland) Act 2005 and no further action is required as it does not qualify as a PPS as defined by the Act and is therefore exempt.

10. CONCLUSION

10.1 This report provides an update on the projects implemented from the Scottish Government ring-fenced Grant for Cycling, Walking and Safer Streets in

- 2011/12, and details the schemes which will be funded from the same Grant in 2012/13.
- 10.2 The report also details schemes where applications for match funding to the Sustrans Community Links Programme 2012/13 have been made.
