

Autism & Learning Disability Strategic Delivery Plan 2022-25

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Context

Autism

 Developmental disorder of variable severity that is characterised by difficulty in social interaction and communication and by restricted or repetitive patterns of thought and behaviour

Learning Disability

Reduced intellectual ability and difficulty with everyday activities. People with a learning disability may take longer to learn and may need support to develop new skills, understand complicated information and interact with other people.

Demand for Services

250 people with complex needs being supported

Total annual cost just under £24m

Most expensive individual care package £331k pa

Increase of £1m to budget year on year

Approx 100 young people supported each year to move into adulthood

Roughly one in five has complex needs, increasing year on year

Strategic Priorities

Support people to live independently in the community

Ensure people have access to all aspects of society

 Ensure people have access to high quality, personalised support when they require it

 Transform support for people with autism and / or a learning disability who have complex needs

Progress to Date

- Development of Small Group Living Units across Perth and Kinross
- Personalised care packages utilising Self Directed Support options
- Day Services transformed into Day Opportunities which provide access to a range of community based learning and leisure activities
- Improved access to health services and development of bespoke services
- Range of services and supports available to support people with autism and their carers
- Specialist services run by Third Sector Organisations including 'One Stop Shop'
- Information made available in Easy Read

Impact

Residential Care

• 83% reduction over past 10 years

Supported Accommodation

• 10% increase over past 10 years

Packages of Care

• 21% increase accessing Option 1 since 2014
