1. WELCOME AND APOLOGIES

Councillor S Donaldson welcomed all present and an apology was noted as above.

2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

There were no declarations of interest in terms of Councillors' Code of Conduct.

3. MINUTE OF PREVIOUS MEETING

The minute of meeting of the Crieff Common Good Fund Committee of 18 December 2019 (Arts. 646-651/19) was submitted and approved.

4. MATTERS ARISING

There were no matters arising.

5. APPLICATIONS FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE – AUGUST 2020

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, members of the Crieff Common Good Fund Committee were contacted, and the following decisions were agreed:

Cllr Brock's declaration of interest was noted for item (1) Kids Week in Crieff

- (1) Kids Week in Crieff be awarded a grant of £500 towards supporting the development of a character trail.
- (2) Crieff and Strathearn Rugby Football Club be refused a grant of £3,000 towards the costs of a rugby development officer in partnership with the Scottish Rugby Union, Active Schools P&K and Morrison's Academy.
- (3) An individual be refused a grant of £2,000 towards the costs of the individual studying animal management and conservation of captive animals at

2021/22 BUDGET & 2020/21 FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Report by Head of Finance

(Report No. 21/55)

PURPOSE OF REPORT

This report seeks approval of the budget for Financial Year 2021/22 and details the Income and Expenditure to 31 March 2021 and the projected outturn for Financial Year 2020/21.

1. BACKGROUND / MAIN ISSUES

1.1 The proposed budget for 2021/22 has been prepared based on activity undertaken in 2020/21 and prior years. This report also provides the monitoring position and projected outturn for the Financial Year 2020/21.

2. PROPOSALS

2.1 Budget 2021/22

As detailed in Appendix 1, it is proposed that the Financial Assistance budget is increased from £1,000 to £1,400 for 2021/22 to increase the funding available to local groups. The £1,600 budget for Rent, Fees & Charges will remain unchanged and the resulting £200 surplus will provide a small contingency for unforeseen expenditure during the year.

2.2 Financial Statement 2020/21

On the basis of Appendix 2, it is anticipated that a surplus of £600 will be generated in financial year 2020/21 and the Fund's Revenue Account Balance is estimated to be £12,466 at 31 March 2021. The year-end projections remain unchanged from the position previously reported to Committee on 17 December 2020 (Report 20/252 refers).

2.3 A final adjustment for interest earned will be completed during April and a further update will be provided at the next meeting of the Committee.

2.4 Financial Statement 2021/22

The Financial Statement for 2021/22 has not been prepared, as at the time of drafting this report, there were no transactions recorded in the 2021/22 ledger for the Crieff Common Good Fund. The decisions of the Committee at this meeting will be incorporated into the 2021/22 Financial Statement to be

presented at future Crieff Common Good Fund Committee meetings.

3. CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATIONS

3.1 The Committee is requested to:

- (i) Approve the Crieff Common Good Fund budget for Financial Year 2021/22 as set out in Appendix 1 to the report.
- (ii) Note the Crieff Common Good Fund Income and Expenditure and the projected outturn to 31 March 2021 as detailed in Appendix 2 to the report.
