COST OF LIVING GRANT

Report by Head of Cultural and Community Services (Report No. 23/333)

1. PURPOSE

1.1 The report asks Perth Common Good Fund Committee agree to make provision for additional Cost of Living support across the winter period.

2. RECOMMENDATION

- 2.1 It is recommended that Committee:
 - Approves the proposal to delegate authority to the Convener to authorise Cost of Living grants between 1 December 2023 and 1 February 2024.

4. BACKGROUND

- 4.1 At the meeting of the Perth Common Good Fund Committee of 6 February 2023 the Committee agreed to earmark £69,500 of underspend from the 2022/23 financial year for Cost of Living support in the Common Good area.
- 4.2 To date approximately £10,000 of this fund has been awarded, leaving a budget of £58,980. The Council has also recently disbursed £68,000 to groups supporting people with the Cost of Living in Perth City through the Warm Welcome Fund for 2023/24.

5. PROPOSAL

5.1 The Perth Common Good Fund Committee next meets on 29 January 2024. It is proposed that the Committee agree to delegate decision making authority for the remaining £58,980 to the Committee Convener for the period between 1 December 2023 and 1 February 2024.

- 5.2 Acting on officer information and advice, the Convener would seek input from other Committee members before approving any funding for specific groups and projects which are supporting residents and families with Cost of Living over the winter period. At the same time, the Convener would welcome suggestions and recommendations from Committee members about groups and projects who may benefit from some support.
- 5.3 Given the nature of the Cost of Living crisis, it is further proposed that Committee agree that any funding paid out during the period between 1 December 2023 and 1 February 2024 is paid in advance once Convener approval has been given.
- 5.4 Officers will provide a verbal update for Committee on 29 January and if required will prepare a report for Committee at the following meeting on 29 April 2024 summarising any funding awards made during the period between 1 December 2023 and 1 February 2024.

6. CONCLUSION

- 6.1 Committee has previously agreed to make a portion of funding available to support Cost of Living related activity in the Common Good area. Only a small part of that funding has been used to date.
- 6.2 Committee is being asked to approve a new approach to the Cost of Living pot within the Common Good Fund. This will allow for more proactive approach to support projects and initiatives across the winter months.
