THE APPLICATION	Mugstock, has applied for a three-year market operator licence to hold a market for 12-50 stalls at a music festival from 2– 5 August 2024.
	Police Scotland, Environment Services and Planning Department have stated they have no objections to this application.
	1 letter of objection from a member of the public has been received regarding this application (see attached letter of objection).
LEGAL POSITION	The Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 provides grounds for refusal of a market operator licence. Any decision to refuse a market operator licence must be relevant to one or more of the following grounds of refusal as detailed in the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982.
	A licensing authority must grant the application unless one of the grounds of refusal exists. If, in the opinion of the Committee, a ground of refusal exists then the application must be refused.
	The grounds for refusal are: -
	The activity to which the licence relates would be managed by or carried on for the benefit of a person, other than the applicant, who would be refused such a licence if they made the application.
	Where the licence relates to an activity consisting of or including the use of premises, those premises are not suitable or convenient for the conduct of the activity having regard to:
	 the location, character or condition of the premises, vehicle or vessel; the nature and extent of the proposed activity; the kind of persons likely to be in the premises, vehicle or
	 vessel; the possibility of undue public nuisance, public order or public safety; or
	there is another good reason for refusing the application.
	In deciding whether to grant or renew a licence, the Council will consider each application on its own merits and will take into account the following:
	any Objections or Representations
	any other relevant considerations
