RENEWAL & REPAIR FUND 2012/13

Report by the Acting Head of Finance

ABSTRACT

This report recommends the programme of works to be funded from the Renewal & Repair Fund in 2012/13.

2. RENEWAL & REPAIR FUND 2011/12

The projected outturn position in respect of the Renewal & Repair Fund in 2011/12 has been reported to previous meetings of this Committee in the Capital Monitoring Reports (Report No's 11/459; 11/598; 12/57 and 12/137 refer).

The final position in respect of the Fund for 2011/12 is detailed in Appendix 1 subject to the completion and audit of the Council's financial statements.

3. RENEWAL & REPAIR FUND 2012/13

No contribution from the General Fund to the Renewal & Repair Fund was approved during the Revenue Budget process for 2012/13. Therefore the projected approved resources for the fund for 2012/13 are as follows:
