**Applications for Financial Assistance****Report by Director (Environment)**

The report asks Coupar Angus Common Good Fund Committee to consider 1 application for financial assistance.

**1. BACKGROUND**

- 1.1 Perth and Kinross Council owns land and property which forms part of the common good of the former burghs in Perth & Kinross and has a statutory duty in terms of section 15 of the Local Government etc. (Scotland ) Act 1994 to administer this land and property “having regard to the interests of the inhabitants” of those former burghs. This duty also applies to the administration of the associated common good funds.
- 1.2 The Common Good Funds have traditionally demonstrated their support to local residents and organisations by distributing grant. These grant awards allow individuals and local organisations to carry out a wide range of community based activities. For each application, the level of previous grant awarded is listed, but variances between years could be due to the numbers of participants. Retrospective applications are not accepted. However, if an application is received before the activities take place and cannot be considered at the following meeting because the papers have already been issued, the application will be considered at the following next meeting even if the activities have taken place between meetings. Therefore, the Committee decision will only be known after the activities have taken place, and if the grant is not awarded, the applicant will have to fund the activities from its own funds.
- 1.3 Applications for Financial Assistance are infrequent and there is no approved Financial Assistance budget for the Fund. The unaudited Revenue balance for the Coupar Angus Common Good Fund at 1 April 2016 is £1,537.

**2. PROPOSAL****Coupar Angus Gala Day**

- 2.1 An application has been received from Coupar Angus Gala Day seeking a grant towards the costs of the ‘Coupar Angus Gala Rocks’ event on 31 July 2016. The event will offer live music, car show, fun fair, food market and stalls for the benefit of all ages. It is anticipated that 2000 people could attend. The total costs are £4,715. The applicant has applied for £2,000 and aims to contribute the rest from fundraising and private donations. If the Committee approve a smaller amount than the one requested, the applicant will have to fund the shortfall from its own reserves or other funding sources. The applicant has not benefited from the fund over the past 3 years.

- 2.2 The proposal meets the criteria of the provision of community benefit for the people (including any individual or group of people) who live in the former burgh served by Coupar Angus Common Good Fund Committee.

### Recommendation

- 2.3 In line with revised guidance, the Committee is asked to consider the request and no recommendation is made by Officers.

**PURPOSE OF REPORT**

This report provides an update on 2015/16 Income and Expenditure, and details of Income and Expenditure to 31 May 2016 and the projected outturn to 31 March 2017 for the Coupar Angus Common Good Fund.

**1. BACKGROUND / MAIN ISSUES**

- 1.1 This report provides an update on the final outturn for 2015/16, and the monitoring position and projected outturn for the Financial Year 2016/17.

**2. PROPOSALS**

2.1 Financial Statement 2015/16

Report 16/90 considered by Committee on 24 February 2016 included year-end projections for Income and Expenditure to 31 March 2016 which included an estimated surplus for the year of £4 and a projected Revenue Account Balance of £1,538 at 31 March 2016. Following closure of the 2015/16 accounts, which remain subject to audit by Audit Scotland, the surplus for the year is £3 and the Revenue Account Balance £1,537 at 31 March 2016.

2.2 Financial Statement 2016/17

On the basis of Appendix 1, it is anticipated that a surplus of £3 will be generated in 2016/17 and that the Fund's estimated Revenue Account Balance will be £1,540 at 31 March 2017.
