2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

3. MINUTE OF MEETING OF ENVIRONMENT, INFRASTRUCTURE AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE OF 20 SEPTEMBER 2023

The minute of the meeting of the Environment, Infrastructure and Economic Development Committee of 20 September 2023 was submitted and approved as a correct record.

5. PERTH AND KINROSS LOCAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN (LDP3) DEVELOPMENT PLAN SCHEME

There was submitted a report by Head of Planning & Development (23/288) seeking approval for the update of the statutory Development Plan Scheme (DPS) relating to the preparation of the next Perth and Kinross Local Development Plan (LDP3).

If the residential property has been operating continuously as a short-term let for more than 10 years owners are eligible to apply for a Certificate of Lawful Use or Development (CLUD) which, if granted, would mean the use would be exempt from planning enforcement action.

Change to:

If the residential property has been operating continuously as a short-term let prior to today's date then temporary planning permission should be given for three years.

7. AUCHTERARDER COMMUNITY FACILITIES FUND

There was submitted a report by Head of Planning and Development (23/290) seeking the determination of an application for funding from Auchterarder Community Sport and Recreation for a contribution of £50,000 towards the installation of a pump track in Auchterarder Public Park on Western Road, Auchterarder.

Resolved:

- (i) This grant request, in principle, of £50,000 by Auchterarder Community Sports and Recreation, as a contribution towards the project to install a Pump Track at Auchterarder Public Park on Western Road, Auchterarder, be considered and determined.

It's become obvious that this is not so much about the traditional way we think about winter in regard to snow and ice but more about all year round resilience.

Committee recognises that ongoing severe weather events have had on our area, including residents of Invergowrie.

We recognise that staff worked incredibly hard in the recent bad weather events, turning out in extremely bad weather when most of us were sheltering from the storm.

Over the years we have already made progress with gully cleaning by specifically targeting problem gullies for further action and an additional £100,000 committed to this by the previous administration has made a small difference.

However, we accept that in some cases blocked roadside gullies, culverts and ditches may have a contributing factor to the outcome of these events, largely in but not restricted to winter.

Committee accepts that the immediate priority of the council should be addressing weather incidents as they arise over the next few months, the recovery and a review of what happened on the weekend of 7/8 October but committee requests officers, as soon as is practical, to conduct a review of the process of gully cleaning, open discussions with SEPA and representatives of the farming and land owning community and to bring any potential proposals for change back to a future committee before summer recess 2024.

#### PROPOSED LIMITED WAITING RESTRICTIONS

# Report by Head of Environmental & Consumer Services (Report No. 24/50)

### 1. PURPOSE

1.1 The purpose of this report is to advise Committee of the proposed Traffic Regulation Order to introduce limited waiting restrictions in Florence Place, Muirton Bank, Harley Terrace, Harley Place and Waiting Restrictions on the Access Road to Leading to Muirton Cottage. The Council received many responses to the consultation with the majority being objections. The Committee is asked to consider the objections and set them aside so that the Order can be made in part, in line with the Ward 12 members' views.

#### 2. RECOMMENDATIONS

- 2.1 It is recommended that Committee:
  - considers the objections received.
  - ii) notes the Ward 12 Elected Members views in paragraph 4.6 and sets aside the objections; and
  - iii) proceeds to make the Order in part to promote the Waiting Restrictions on Harley Place, Harley Terrace and the Access Road

#### 4. BACKGROUND/MAIN ISSUES

4.1 Parking restrictions in the Muirton area had been looked at on three previous occasions. The request for parking restrictions at the various locations were requested previously by a Local Elected Member and the Community Council. On each occasion, during informal consultation, the Council failed to get a consensus from the residents of that area. While some councillors had stated that they do not consider the restrictions necessary, they did not object to their

- installation. However, due to the lack of wider community support, and the inability to address objections, the proposals were dropped each time.
- 4.2 In 2023, an Elected Member and the Community Council requested that this matter be considered again. It was suggested that there was community support this time, and, as a result, officers progressed the necessary Traffic Regulation Order on that understanding.
- 4.3 As part of the legal process, officers were required to carry out statutory consultation to promote the Perth and Kinross Council (Perth Traffic Management) (Variation) (No 24) Order 2023, to include parking restrictions in the Muirton area of Perth. The Order seeks to introduce limited waiting restrictions on Muirton Bank, Florence Place, Harley Terrace and Harley Place with a short section of "No Waiting at Any Time" restrictions proposed on the Access Road off Muirton Bank leading to the North Inch.
- 4.4 The proposed restrictions can be seen in Appendix 1.
- 4.5 During the statutory consultation process, 136 responses were received. They were as follows:
  - 102 objections
  - 22 responses in support
  - 12 letters requesting similar restrictions on other sections of Florence Place.
- 4.6 The responses were discussed at a meeting with three of the four ward members, with one unable to attend the meeting. The responses to the consultation were discussed with the ward members and it was agreed that, due to the level of objections, that the Order should not be made as advertised. It was agreed that Muirton Bank and Florence Place should be withdrawn from the proposal. However, due to the access issues that have been experienced on Harley Terrace, Harley Place and the Access Road, the members present felt that the proposed restrictions on these streets should be included and be progressed.
- 4.7 During the statutory advertisement period, 136 responses were received, and copies of full objections and responses are contained in Appendix 2.
- 4.8 A number of similar objections were received from residents and groups to the proposed Traffic Regulation Order. A summary of these objections are as follows:
  - residents parking at properties would be negatively impacted. Residents thought the proposal would make it difficult for them to park close to their properties.
  - visitors to properties would be negatively impacted. This included tradesmen, carers, family and friends finding it difficult to park closer to desired properties and having to walk long distances from available parking.

- the golf clubs would be negatively impacted through a reduction in members and visitors, resulting in lost income.
- visitors to the North Inch would not be able to find suitable parking and not be able to use the facility for exercise etc.
- competitors in the Parkrun would not be able to find suitable parking and result in a negative impact on the Parkrun.
- residents did not think the described issues existed and it was a perceived issue.
- not having adjacent on-street parking would have a negative impact on property value.
- residents parking permit scheme is not included within the proposal.
- difficulty for users to access the Strathmoor Centre which is a key location for Services for Children, Young People and Families. This centre holds family change, therapeutic services for children experience trauma, Family support team and COPE team who work around the clock until 10pm. This centre is also used for statutory contact.
- 4.9 A number of similar responses in support were received from residents and groups to the proposed Traffic Regulation Order. A summary of the reasons are as follows:
  - residents experienced obstructive parking blocking them in or out of their driveways/access to property.
  - difficulties with obstructive parking preventing access to the streets.
  - abuse received when challenging drivers who park inappropriately.
  - allegations that vehicles with No MOT or Tax are being parked on the street for lengthy periods of time.
  - the area is being used as a free car park for commuters.
  - parking has caused issues with waste collection resulting in residents moving bins.

4.10 A breakdown of objections and support is shown in the table below:

Note 1: in some cases, multiple objections were received from a single property. However Legal Services have advised that legally we must consider each as an individual objection.

Note 2: 12 letters were received requesting similar restrictions on other sections of Florence Place.

- 4.11 Under the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Procedure) (Scotland) Regulations 1999, local authorities are permitted to make a Traffic Regulation Order in part while deferring or withdrawing one or more items of the proposed Traffic Regulation Order.
- 4.12 As there is limited support to introduce the Limited Waiting Restrictions on Muirton Bank and Florence Place, it is proposed that these are withdrawn from the TRO and the TRO made in part.

#### 5. PROPOSALS

5.1 The revised proposal, agreed with the ward members who attended the meeting, is shown in Appendix 3.

#### 6. CONCLUSION

6.1 This report provides an update on the consultation for limited waiting restrictions proposed for the Muirton Bank area. The report details the responses received and provides an insight into the reasoning behind the objections and support. The report recommends that the objections are set aside and that the Order is promoted in part, to alleviate obstructive parking on Harley Terrace, Harley Place and the Access Road leading to the North Inch.



Thank you for your email responding to the consultation for Perth Traffic Management Order Vo 24 regarding proposed Limited Waiting Restrictions in the Muirton Bank area. Details of the proposal can be seen in the attached plan.

In total, 136 responses were received with 102 objections, 23 in support and 11 responses asking for similar measures in neighbouring streets. A summary of all of the responses were sent to the Ward 12 Elected Members for their consideration on how they wish to proceed.

Following discussion with the Ward 12 members, I can confirm that a report will be submitted to the Environment, Infrastructure and Economic Development Committee. The report will recommend the Committee considers the objections and set aside objections to allow the Traffic Regulation Order to be made in partial to promote the Limited Waiting Restrictions Harley Place, Harley Terrace and No Waiting at Any Time restrictions on the Access Road. #### Dear Sirs,

I am shocked and extremely disappointed to read of the proposed traffic order stopping daytime waiting on the above roads near North Inch, and have set out a number of reasons below.

North Inch is a much loved and well used community facility by many residents of Perth and surrounding areas, but not many residents are within easy walking distance of it and therefore require a car to access it.

I know many people, of all ages, who run there, who play golf on North Inch, who walk their dogs, who attend classes at Bell's Sports Centre, plus the youngsters who use the park or the rugby / football pitches. Surely as a council you should be promoting the use of these spaces and making them more not less accessible, from both a mental and physical health perspective?

I play golf on North Inch and regularly park in Muirton Bank. I am always careful to park considerately, to avoid restricting visibility and make sure I am not blocking access to someone's drive (including if I am parked opposite). It is almost impossible to play golf on North Inch without taking a car with clubs and trolley....it is not possible to do this using public transport. Only the very few people who live within a very close area will be able to continue. This would have a huge impact on local golf clubs that use North Inch. This would be a tragedy when North Inch golf course has been so successful in recent years attracting new members including many young people.


I have friends who live in Florence Place and Muirton Bank, and I know that they are upset at these proposals because it will also cause them problems when people come to visit, or do work at their properties.

There is insufficient formal car parking in the immediate vicinity which is why many people park in these roads.

These proposals have not been well publicised so there has not been the opportunity for many Perth residents to make their views known.

I understand some concern about the short access route from Muirton Bank down to the entry to North Inch, and would accept there should perhaps be restrictions there.

Also if there are other points which cause problems with visibility if people don't park carefully, it should surely be possible to have small sections with yellow lines rather than a blanket prohibition on all of the roads?

With reference to proposed restrictions of parking on Muirton Bank, Perth and Kinross Council (Perth Traffic Management) Variation No. 24 Order 202X we wish to object for the following reasons.

- 1.Tradesmen would not be prepared to take on jobs if they could not have their vehicles on hand with their tools. The suggestion that there is parking on the access road to the North Inch is not feasible as this road is full of cars from morning to evening and even if this was possible no tradesman is going to walk back and forward the length of Muirton Bank while carrying out work.
- 2. There are residents in the street who require daily access of carers and a good number more approaching this group, like ourselves.
- 3. It would not be possible for many residents to hold family gatherings as some properties only have room on their drives for one extra car.
- 4. There has been a distinct lack of publicity on the resurrection of this scheme first mooted in 2015.







The issue of parking in Muirton (particularly around Strathmoor) was brought to my attention on Friday. Please see emails below. I had asked the could help resolve matters and as you will see I have now been referred to you.

Strathmoor, is a key location for Services for Children, Young People and Families. We host Family Change, a therapeutic service for children experiencing trauma, we also have our Family Support team and COPE team based there who work around the clock until 10pm and we have some families using the building for statutory contact (a legal requirement).



Objection to "Perth & Kinross Council (Perth Traffic Management) (Variation) (No.24) Order 202X

Dear Sir/Madam,

who was heavily involved with parking issues in Harley Place, Harley Terrace, Muirton Bank, Florence Place and Muirton Place in 2019-20. Whilst I no longer have any involvement with NI&MCC, do not live in any of these streets and will not personally be impacted by the effects of this proposal, I remain concerned for the adverse impacts this proposal will have on the wider community as well as the waste of public money, time and resource to resolve perceived problems that do not actually exist. There are easier, meaningful, less contentious solutions if consideration was made as to what the real "problems" are.

I wish to object to the above Variation Order. I would suggest that this be put forward to the appropriate Committee at which I would like to speak.

My objection is based on the following reasons.

- The reasons provided for applying these restrictions namely:
  - a) Prevent obstructive parking
  - b) Enhance visibility at junctions
  - c) Improve safety for all road users are not actually problems that exist other than Harley Place/Terrace in respect of a) only.

This is a "false flag" approach by failing to identify what the real problems are.

NI&MCC, who will be pushing this proposal, are demonstrating a "faux" concern about road safety. In 2021, they strongly refused to support residents in the south of Balhousie Street and in Barossa Place who requested Vehicle Activated Signs based on empirical evidence of traffic speeds and knowledge of 21 accidents in the previous two years. After pressure on PKC and considerable chasing by ourselves we have finally got two VASs in Balhousie Street, but it is no thanks to NI&MCC.

2. Perth & Kinross Council have previously had different parking issues put to them in 2015, 2016 and 2019. In 2016, point 1b and 1c was addressed by double yellow lines at junctions of Muirton Bank with Florence Place, Muirton Place and the access road to the North Inch.

Two of the stated reasons for the restrictions have therefore already been resolved unless PKC now believes that the action they took in 2016 was inadequate.

3. Harley Place and Harley Terrace are particularly narrow streets where vehicles parked in certain places can cause obstructions. In general, I do not object to the proposals for these streets.

However, in the other streets, I have data that demonstrates that the only obstruction was that of access to a property (not an offence) observed on only one occasion in the past 18 months (in Florence Place). I also have evidence that the number of vehicles parked in Muirton Place (north of Florence Place) and in Florence Place has remained markedly less than pre-Covid levels.

Excepting Harley place and Harley Terrace, this action is wasting public time, money and resource to solve problems that do not exist.

- 4. A lack of meaningful communication with:
  - a) Residents of the streets involved, One lady in Muirton Bank confirmed to me this morning that she had not received any notification about these proposals and was unaware of the Variation Order or its implications even though there was a notice on the lamppost immediately outside her house.
  - b) The wider community who will be adversely impacted by forcing 60 vehicles to park elsewhere. Any belief that drivers will suddenly walk or use buses is naive in the extreme.
  - c) Those who currently have a "legitimate" need to park in these streets to access the North Inch (park runners, golfers, and those attending sporting tournaments).

North Inch & Muirton Community Council have posted no communication on their Facebook page nor in local newspapers (which they have done on previous occasions) – no doubt because it would draw widespread criticism. They have not conducted a public meeting which was something I had agreed with residents that I would do as Chair of NI&MCC before Covid put paid to it and I felt it necessary to resign.

In early 2022, NI&MCC issued different proposals to residents which involved unspecified time limited parking and free resident and visitor permits. Their changed stance does not appear to have been communicated to residents so where is the evidence that residents support this Variation Order.

- 5. If this Variation Order includes free permits for residents there would be reasons to object to this. If there are no resident permits, where is the evidence that residents fully appreciate that the parking restrictions apply equally to them, their visitors and trades people.
- 6. Even if evidence of adequate communication is produced, these proposals are based on opinions rather than empirical evidence (which I possess). On previous occasions, PKC has not taken the action that residents or the Community Council have suggested because it did not see evidence of the stated problems. If PKC proceeds with this, based on opinions only, there will be huge implications elsewhere. Any section of street that claims they have a problem must be treated in exactly the same way.
- 7. No explanation as to why Muirton Place (between Muirton Bank and Balhousie St) was not included in this Variation Order in any way. This street was included in the Community Council's proposals of 2022 but there has been no letter issued to notify residents of that street as to why they were no longer included.

That section of Muirton Place has far more vehicles parked in it than any of the other streets mentioned and, if there are issues in the other streets (perceived rather than real), they apply equally to Muirton Place.

8. The members of NI&MCC who will be pushing this most, live in Florence Place. This is significant because genuine parking issues exist in other streets in the Community Council area and only tackling perceived issues in their streets is hardly taking a community wide approach and rather looks like "feathering one's own nest". Why is PKC supporting this without physical/empirical evidence?

- 9. The approach road to the North Inch typically contains about 30 vehicles during daytime hours. These are not resident's vehicles and they are not causing any obstruction. It is possible that there may be some problems of access/egress to the entrance to one property at the North Inch end but that could easily be resolved by extending double yellow lines. Introducing No Waiting at any Time is unnecessarily forcing 30 vehicles that are doing no harm to move elsewhere and, whilst this isn't technically making this street a private road, it is making it "exclusive" for one resident's use.
- 10. Where is the evidence that the restricted parking will be enforced. Parking Wardens already fail to act on vehicles parked on existing double yellow lines in Harley Place (not that they are doing any harm) or at Balhousie Stores which is a genuine safety issue. Are the traffic wardens going to be selective about which yellow lines they enforce?

I would reiterate that there are easier, meaningful, less contentious solutions if consideration was made as to what the real "problems" are. I am quite happy to discuss this further provided it is with those whose minds are not fixed.

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

I am emailing regarding the "no parking" restrictions that planned to go forward.

As someone who lived on Harley Place for 23 years I have not once felt our street, or the surrounding, are busy with cars/ congested. These streets are quiet majority of the time only becoming a little busy when events are on even then I have still been able to park and never had an issue.

I no longer live on Harley place anymore, as of a few months ago, but my parents do. If this goes ahead I will have nowhere to park when visiting (along with any other visitors) as they only have space for one car in the drive, this is the same for a lot of people with many parking their cars on the street. With no parking permits being permitted you are taking away parking spaces of those who live there, where will they park?

I work within a care service providing care to those in the community - I have clients around these areas that will be affected by this. We run by a tight schedule as it is and with no parking access to these houses I cannot provide efficient care to clients and this makes my job a lot harder as well as negatively impacting the care provided for clients. I can imagine this would the same for NHS workers - who are already under a severe amount of stress/understaffing.

These parking restrictions will also limit tradesmens access to houses.

The north inch holds many events throughout the year as well as the park run every Saturday - these restrictions will deter people from coming to these events if they cannot find an appropriate parking spot. The fact that perth is becoming more quiet with less shops, less business and and little things to do you'd think the council would support events like this and welcome people - this will do the opposite.

As well as all of the above, other places will also be affected by this - north inch golf club and bowling club, other sports such as football and rugby held on the north inch, bells sports centre... The list could go on.

Absolutely ridiculous putting these restrictions in place and it will cause a lot more negative affects than positive, if any.

I hope these concerns will be taken seriously as from speaking to other neighbours it seems more would oppose this enforcement that support it.

- "Enhance visibility at junctions". The junction between Florence Place and Muirton Bank already has double yellow lines at the junctions keeping visibility clear for road users.
- "Improve road safety for all users". Florence Place currently has a 20 mph speed limit. How about enforcing it?

And why is all parking not being banned on Hay Street, Balhousie Street, Balhousie Avenue and Muirton Place? I would argue they have more problems than Florence Place.

On a personal level I am worried about where my family will be able to park when they come to stay. We also have a second vehicle and not having the luxury of an extensive driveway we will have to consider destroying our front garden (a mature heather garden) to create a second parking space. I would hate to have to do this. Also tradesmen coming to the house, boiler service etc, are they and us to scrabble for a space further up Florence Place or on Muirton place, Hay Street, Balhousie Street?


I do not recall any consultation about this and am aghast that this idea is being proposed when for me there is no issue. Sometimes I can park outside my property, which is great and sometimes I can't,I don't own the street, but if this proposal is implemented I and no one else will be able to park outside my property or anywhere near my home, any day during the day!

I believe the persons behind this proposal are self centred with a belief that the on street parking available outside their properties is for their sole use. I am aware that some people even move vehicles from their driveways first thing in the morning to park on the street and so prevent others vehicles from parking there.

I also think there is an agenda with this proposal to target the Perth Parkrun. I am not involved in Parkrun but I am aware some local residents are not happy about people parking in the area to attend the run. Again a selfish attitude, it takes place once a week for a couple of hours and as long as people park sensibly I fail to see the problem.

Non residents do park in Florence Place but I have never once thought that this is terrible and the solution is just to ban anyone from parking, especially if that includes us who live here and don't have extensive off road parking!!

To summarise Florence Place does not have a parking or road safety problem. The proposed parking restrictions are totally unnecessary and not required.

Please find our objections to the proposed parking restrictions which have only now come to our attention and which we are vehemently opposed to. We are a family who have lived in this neighbourhood with children and animals for several years and have celebrated the access rights of all who wish to enjoy the civic space of the North Inch Park to date.

There has been almost no notice of these plans offered to the community other than a tiny poster at the end of the road by Muirton Bank. We note that the deadline for opposing is now 5 days from today.

We wish to formally object to the ill-thought-out and discriminatory proposal on the basis of the following points and questions:

Double yellow lines on both sides of the roads will increase the speed of vehicles. This is a residential area in which many people, young and old, animals, wheelchair and pram users, school children, runners, golfers and cyclists frequent.

With the proposed restrictions we will immediately lose the opportunity for visitors and family members to park close by.

The proposal will have a profound effect on carers, medical visits, delivery vehicles and trades companies to undertake essential and emergency work.

Lack of on street parking will have a direct impact on the value of many homes in this vicinity.

This proposal will simply move many more cars to Muirton Place, Dalhousie Street, Hay Street and half of Florence Place.

We feel very strongly that the North Inch Park is a civic space and this proposed plan for parking restrictions will impact directly on so many users. Park run, golfers, Perthshire Rugby, children's play park, dog walkers, walkers, families with young children in buggies, elderly people who may not be able to walk any distance and those who attend cultural events which take place in the park.

The current situation works well for those of us on Muirton Bank and all who wish to visit the park. There are several houses who have no drive ways or garage. How will they be guaranteed any parking nearby their homes?

We wonder why there has been so little consultation with those of us on the streets which it will affect the most.

We were (falsely) informed that residents parking permits would be offered to those who live here. We have now been led to believe that PKC do not issue permits. Why would there not be allocated permit areas for residents on Muirton Bank, Florence Place, Harley Place and Harley Terrace if you are moving forward with this proposal?

Why are the restrictions proposed every day of each week? If the pressing issue is the impact of people parking who work in the city centre why are the restrictions also imposed on a Saturday and Sunday? The volume of activity on a weekend means that spaces on Muirton Bank are essential for people attending events and enjoying such a wonderful civic space.

This proposal has been put forward in a very underhand way and has been far from transparent.

We do not want, nor do we need parking restrictions imposed in our streets. The lack of consulation with all residents for this proposal is very concerning.

My name is live in Florence place. I am emailing today for the second time regarding the plan to put parking restrictions along my street. I fully reject to this plan and feel this is not necessary at all. I have been off on maternity leave now for over 1 year and at no time have I witnessed a problem within this street for parking. Many if not over half the houses in this street have drive ways. However I am in a council house and have no driveway and

park outside my house on street. Returning to work and working shift patterning and working on call for the NHS I need my car to be close to my house. This is less likely to be the case if you limit the parking. 
I suggested at the last business owner meeting held at the Royal George that parking is still needed and now PKC are trying to eliminate what little free parking is left.

Hello,

I am emailing to raise my concerns and objection to the above proposed parking restriction at Muirton bank, Florence Place, Harley Place and Harley Terrace. I am the Golf Course Officer for Perth and Kinross Council and manage the North Inch Golf Course. Although the vast majority of our golfers park at Bells Sports Centre, due to the often extreme pressure for parking spaces there our users will be required to park in the areas covered by these proposed new restrictions.

By restricting parking in the proposed area, this will put even greater pressure on the Bells Sports centre area and I believe this would lead to more obstructive parking than can be seen in the proposed areas. I have 3 members of staff who have also parked in this area for over 15 years without any issues and they would no longer be able to do so. I park in this area for short periods of time several times per week, when dropping off supplies or having meetings with staff at the golf green keepers compound and have not witnessed any issues with excessive parking during these daytime hours. I do however understand the narrow street issues at Harley Terrace and Harley Place.

I do understand that at weekends when the North Inch park is busy and especially Saturday morning's when both the golf course is busy and Perth Parkrun is taking place that the proposed area can be overrun with vehicles, but this is exactly the same for the Bells Sports centre area and other surrounding streets and is not an exclusive issue for the proposed area. As the North Inch Park has become much busier, increasing parking capacity rather than reducing may need to be explored.

One of member clubs, Perth Artisan Golf Club have had their clubhouse at 7 Harley Terrace since 1936. These proposals would affect them greatly, as they only have around 5 parking spaces at their clubhouse with other members normally using on street parking. If restrictions were put in place, then this would drive much of this traffic back to the Bells Sports centre area.

Please see below details of a Parking survey of the proposed area undertaken by the council's Traffic and Network team on behalf of North Inch golf course in 2019.

Attached is the summary of the parking survey undertaken by the Traffic & Network Team on Muirton Bank, Harley Place and Harley Terrace – seven surveys over eight different days (including weekends) between 18<sup>th</sup> April and 23<sup>rd</sup> May 2019.

**Muirton Bank** 

There was regular, long-term parking by both residents and park users (golfers, runners, dog walkers, etc) at the south end of Muirton Bank. There was regular, long-term parking by residents at the north end of Muirton Bank. During one hour on one day, Muirton Bank was at capacity. During one hour on four occasions, Muirton Bank was near capacity. The remainder of the time, the street was under capacity. While parking may be a cause for concern amongst the local community, there was no evidence of obstruction; and there appears to be no traffic management or road safety reasons for introducing parking restrictions.

The 75m section of road from Muirton Bank to the Inch, between Florence Place and Muirton Place, was observed but not recorded as it lay outside the requested survey area. The street was occupied, near capacity, most of the time on all the survey dates. About half of the vehicles were parked long-term. The other half saw a frequent turnover of vehicles by park users.


#### **Harley Place**

The main issue was the restricted road width caused by residents parking their vehicles on the carriageway. The reduced road space made negotiating the street difficult but this did not constitute obstruction. The narrow road helped suppress vehicle speeds. During one hour on one day, the main section of Harley Place was over capacity with a vehicle parked at the Harley Terrace junction. During one hour on one day, Harley Place was at capacity. The small spur to the west of Harley Place was occupied long-term on all occasions, although not always at capacity. Most of the usage at this location was by golfers rather than residents.

#### **Harley Terrace**

Parking on Harley Terrace was always under capacity. During several morning visits, the bottom of the street and part of the turning area was occupied by golfers. The parking on the remainder of the street was by residential traffic.

The main issue on Harley Terrace was the obstruction of the carriageway which caused the Council's bin lorry to drive along the footway. As the footway construction is generally lighter than the road, this may be causing damage to utilities and services underneath the surface. We are liaising with our Roads Maintenance colleagues and, if damage is recorded, parking restrictions may be necessary. In addition, two private properties appear to have unauthorised access (no dropped kerbs or alterations to the footway).

I wish to object to the proposed Order. The reasons given for the Order are 'to prevent obstructive parking, enhance visibility at junctions and improve road safety for all road users'.


I disagree that the Order will prevent obstructive parking. Muirton Bank, Florence Place and Harley Terrace are all wide enough to allow safe, albeit careful, access to and from private driveways. The wide grass verges on Muirton Bank in particular mean that there is adequate visibility and space for vehicles entering and leaving those private driveways. A sensible approach would be to use white lines, to demarcate driveway entrances, or use short sections of waiting restrictions (double yellow lines) across the driveways.

I disagree that the Order will enhance visibility at any road junction. The plans show no change to the existing no waiting restrictions at the junctions listed. Therefore it can't be said that the Order will enhance visibility at junctions.

I agree that it will improve road safety for all road users in this area, but it is likely to encourage obstructive parking in other areas, potentially to the detriment of road safety in those areas.

I write this as a regular park user. I and others attend Parkrun on Saturday mornings and occasionally park on Muirton Bank, for circa 1 hour. Removing the ability to park on this and surrounding streets between 8 and 6 will in my eyes discourage participation in Parkrun and potentially other leisure activities. Bell Sports Centre car park is often busy at weekends when it is hosting events and likewise when Perthshire Rugby are playing at home. The next nearest car parks are Kinnoull Street MSCP, or North Muirton Community Campus, both a considerable walk from the park.



#### Good morning,

We wish to lodge our objection to the plans for Muirton Bank and surrounding roads which will have yellow lines and parking restrictions applied.

We live in Muirton Place, an area already under severe pressure regarding parking spaces. This is because commuters park on the street and walk into Perth town centre, and also over the weekend the street is overrun with traffic from events at the North Inch, such as rugby and the Park Run. It can be impossible to park near our home, and we often have to park on nearby places such as Florence Place and Muirton Bank. We see no consideration in these plans for such circumstances.

If these plans go ahead, they will encourage even more traffic onto our road who would previously have left their cars on Florence Place or Muirton Bank. There are many older families here who would struggle with this change in having to park some distance away.

In fact, we anticipate having to park in Bell's if this plan goes ahead, because of what we have explained with the current situation with chronic parking issues. It will also cause problems for access for emergency vehicles for residents such as ambulances (we are a street of mostly retirees) and also works vehicles such as needed for home maintenance and repairs. At the moment, there is no capacity for any extra vehicles, which this new plan would cause.

We have flagged this up to our local Community Council on numerous occasions, and we understood that Muirton Place was to be included in the trial of yellow lines and permits. However, we have simply been ignored. We urge you to reconsider these plans. Some people will benefit, mainly those with private driveways but as a 'free parking' street, we cannot see how this will work without causing massive problems for the residents of Muirton Place.

I would like to object to the above reference. I believe the reasons the council are planning to turning these streets into 'No Daytime Waiting' restriction doesn't make sense at all. According the reasoning as in the document and I quote

#### "COUNCIL REASONS"

The Council is planning to implement 'No Daytime Waiting' restrictions at Muirton Bank, Florence Place, Harley Place and Harley Terrace in Perth. Additionally, a 'No Waiting at Any Time' restriction will be implemented at the end of the Access Road off Muirton Bank leading to North Inch in Perth. The aim of these measures is to prevent obstructive parking, enhance visibility at junctions, and improve safety for all road users."

May I address a number of the reasoning in above paragraph?

Obstructive parking – I think the offending drivers who obstruct parking can still be issued fines by the parking attendants. We have a lot of road offenders who will continue to park without a care for other road users. I think this can be achieved by the parking attendants patrolling these areas more frequently and issuing fines. The presence of parking attendants is already a deterrent.


Enhance Visibility at Junctions – the double yellow lines already serve this purpose so I don't see why you would want to continue wasting our council tax payments on projects that don't serve any significant purpose. The money you are saving can be used somewhere else where it is really needed.

Improve safety for all road users — it goes without saying that we all want the safety for all road users but this will never be achieved by punishing the people who park in these roads. I have been a golfer at the North Inch Golf course for over 23 years and in all the years I have played golf there, the safety of our members and our neighbours has been a matter we care about and take seriously. During the peak periods when the North Inch has had activities on for example when there has been people taking part in running, finding a parking space has been a nightmare. If you paint the double yellow lines all the way, people will start parking in nearby residential areas and start upsetting more neighbouring residents. When that happens, are you going to keep painting double yellow lines in all residential areas? I think not.

Golf has been played on the North Inch for many years and restricting parking near the golf course is going to be detrimental to the income the golf course generates. We have Bells sport centre car part that carters for all sorts of clients ranging from the Bells Sports Users, Rugby Users and the Golf course users. 

I am a resident of Muirton Place who parks on the street.

I am writing to object to the proposed parking restrictions proposed for Muirton Bank, Florence Place and Harley place /terrace.

Firstly i would like point out the manner in which this proposal has been disseminated is far from ideal. I happened to be walking down Florence Place when the notice was being attached to lamp posts. I subsequently went to the pkc /TRO web page as directed by the notice, but this TRO is not listed there. Consequently i used the chat bot to ask PKC for some information. I interacted with Lesely , who was very helpful and sent me the map of the proposed plans. In the chat i did mention that the TRO was not on the web page as advertised on the published notice. I am therefore disappointed to see that even today (18/10/2023) this TRO is still not listed on PKC /TRO page( which was last updated on 2nd September). It is not a great impression if the council can not even put the proposal on their own web site and clearly makes it more difficult for members of the public to review the plans. Secondly i find it surprising that the notice of these proposed changes were not placed on any of the surrounding streets such as Muirton place which will clearly be affected by the consequence of these parking restrictions. This appears to be an oversight or a complete disregard for the opinion of all residents of Muirton who will be influenced by these changes.

I am a resident and street parker on Muirton Place so our street is not directly affected. However i think the consequences will affect people like me and subsequently impinge on other residents. I normally visit my mother in her care home in Blairgowrie every morning, when i return the space outside my house is normally gone, as many people park on Muirton Place to access the inch, town and care home. Consequently, i normally park along Muirton Bank and collect my car each evening to park outside my property on Muirton place. Muirton bank on a normal work day always has free parking places. If these new parking restriction come into place i will be forced to go somewhere else which is more like to annoy other residents as no other streets have these free spaces during the day. I think these parking restriction will block all the streets in the area making it difficult for people to access the inch for exercise, dog walking, golf etc. The streets are already overloaded on a Saturday morning for the park run and this will just make things much more difficult and maybe even put people off coming to the inch.

Saftey is of course a very important on or roads but i think the proposal is draconian as described. Access is only a problem along Muirton Bank when people, for some unknown reason, decide to park on both sides of the road without thinking about the consequences and not leaving space. Therefore, i think a much better solution would be to put a

parking restriction only on the west side of Muirton bank leaving the east side still free for parking. It should also be noted that Muirton bank does have grass verges and the road could be widened.

Florence place is also a relatively wide street so it is unclear why 3/4 of the street require parking restrictions.

Therefore i would like to register my objection to the proposal as i think it will cause more problems than it will solve and also suggest the council could do a lot more to canvas genuine public opinion in the area, as i have yet to speak to anyone in favour of these changes.



My objection to the proposed parking changes is based on the immediate direct personal impact this move will have on the health and well being of me and my family.

My two daughters who visit regularly with young children during the day will have to park a long way from our home in Muirton Bank, providing they can in fact find a space, as there will be a huge demand for spaces outside our no parking area.

We rely on each other for help as I provide child care and they help me a lot. Our mutual support will become difficult if not impossible.

Arthritis in my knees prevents me from walking any distance. I rely on being able to come and go from my house during the day to attend hospital appointments and social events.

I may be unable to repark near home during the day if I go out. I feel this move discriminates against older people particularly with mobility problems like me, who need to come and go during daytime working hours. Faced with the possibility of not being able to repark, I will feel less inclined to go out.

If the parking restrictions go ahead, when I need careers to visit they will not be able to park nearby, thus reducing the time they will be able to spend with us.

Those people who help us with gardening, odd jobs and cleaning will no longer be able to park nearby and I fear that they will stop coming if they are forced to carry equipment any distance.

In summary I object because the parking restrictions will significantly affect the health and well being of me and my family and I am sure it will affect other households in the same way.

I would also like to see the evidence for the need for these restrictions. How many accidents have actually taken place in our vicinity?

Personally, I have never been adversely affected by the existing parking rules, and I am happy to put up with minor inconvenience if it allows other citizens to access the excellent leisure resouces available on the North Inch.

I feel that the occasional inconvenience caused to a small number of householders through irresponsible parking has triggered a draconian response from the Council which will impact many more families in a negative way

I understand that members of the North Inch and Muirton community council visited some households to seek support for no parking measues in the area. However their proposals would only work with residents and visitors permits.

Without parking permits for residents or designated additional parking areas our surrounding streets will effectively become no-go areas for visitors to our homes, increasing the feeling of isolation for older residents.




I am writing to lodge my objection to the proposed plan to introduce parking restrictions on Muirton Bank Perth, PH1 5DW

Many different people park on the street to have easy access to the North Inch to go for walks, to exercise their dogs, to play golf, to take their children to the play park there or to visit Bells Sports Centre. Many pensioners use the North Inch to go for a walk as it is a safe environment and when open toilet facilities available at Bells. Unreasonable and discriminatory to the General Public with Perth & Kinross Council acceding to the demands of a number of residents within the private housing areas, having been spearheaded through the Community Council. This is particularly obvious in as much that the proposals do not extend beyond No 24 Florence Place. Also that this is the 24 Variation!

- There is already adequate provision of double yellow lines at junctions for providing visibility.
- Florence Place is a wide street that reasonable accommodates for four car widths and does not merit the additional measures being proposed.
- Frontage from Florence Place to Muirton Place consists mainly of Hedging, Trees and Fence. Further yellow lines in this area will not improve visibility.
- A more sensible option along Muirton Bank is to widen the road with the removal of the grass verges.
- •. The access road from Muirton Bank to North Inch, locally known as Manse Brae, is understood to be a private road referred to within the deeds of the former manse, 9 Muirton Bank.

please accept this email as my objection to the Traffic Order 202x

I completely disagree with the three reasons given. There are no issues with safety for road users, obstructive parking or visability at junctions on any of the roads included in this order. In fact I find it absurd given that since the increase in home working post covid the roads in this area are now very quiet as there is no overspill of people looking to park in these streets and walk into town to their place of work. I therefore do not see any reason whatsoever for the measures and would have expected as part of the order to have seen some evidence of the apparent issues that are being quoted. To further validate my point I have attached pictures of the streets concerned over the last few days. As can clearly be seen, there are no issues. Indeed there are hardly any cars in the area. I would ask that these pictures are treated as evidence of very quiet peaceful area which has no safety, obstruction or junction visability issues.

As well as disagreeing with the reasons quoted I also need to stress that these measures would cause serious hardship for many residents. I present the following issues that your measures would create ...

- 1. Household parking options would be unfairly limited.
- 2. Friends and relatives would be prevented from visiting in their cars and this would deprive many of the elderly residents in the area of much needed company and support leaving them isolated and vulnerable
- 3. It would limit and in many cases prevent tradesmen from supplying much needed services to the residents, eg emergency plumbing/electrical, garden maintenance, and again this would have greater impact on the elderly residents who would be helpless and at risk
- 4. Our community nurses and day carers would be severely disadvantaged and this would impact on the care they can provide to residents if they have to walk greater distances thereby reducing time with patients, carrying supplies and also simply not being able to access the resident's house if they are unable to park close enough. Can you also imagine in winter it is ridiculous and at a time where residents are cold and hungry and in need of care they would be deprived of this help.
- 5. Many parents would not be able to access the very popular play area, depriving their children of the chance to play with their friends and for people to meet socially.
- 6. The North Inch Golf course which is a beautiful gold course would be harder to access and would therefore attract less players and it could threaten it's viability
- 7. Bells Sports Centre is a major draw for the city. These parking restrictions would cause inconvenience and would lead to a reduction in numbers of visitors to the area
- 8. Cars would be forced onto Muirton Place and Balhousie Street and then we would see these areas hit with obstructive parking, junction visability and general road safety issues for road users.

In summary there is no requirement whatsoever for these measures. The issues quoted simply do not exist and these measures would cause great inconvenience and threaten the safety and well-being of the elderly and vulnerable residents. It would in short be a disaster for the community!!

I am writing to strongly object to the above proposed parking restrictions.

We have lived in the property since 2020 and have never had an issue with parking or traffic in the area.

Despite the number of people visiting the park or walking to work, parking is always available within 20 yards of our house.

Having 3 school age children means we are in and out of the house going to activities and school between the hours of 8am-6pm every day.

Living at we have no access to off street parking.

- Despite having a garage neither of our cars can access this and allow space to open a door to exit the car, not sure why this was allowed by planning.
- We would be forced with 3 children to battle for places on roads several streets away.
- In winter we would not be able to safely defrost the car in a timely manner.

We also have regular elderly visitors who would not manage the walk, easy access and free parking was a key consideration in us moving here.

# I would like to raise the following:

- Adding yellow lines will move the cars to streets further away and increase competition for places resulting in more cars involved in inconsiderate parking in these areas.
- Cars are likely to drive much faster along Muirton Bank if there are no cars limiting it to one car at a time, reducing safety for the pupils walking to St Johns.
- The park is a civic space used by hundreds of people every day, residents along Muirton Bank accept this and like the life this brings to the area. The last thing we want is for less people to be able to use the park.
- Limiting access to the park will stop locals from Perth turning up to walk their dogs, teach their kids to ride bikes and turn the park into a deserted space.
- Even on Event days, such as Park Run, Rugby matches, Beer festivals or Mela's the streets are never overcrowded.
- There are many residents who need services to access their properties, from NHS home visits, to window cleaners and gardeners to cut grass for elderly locals, this would cease to be feasible under this proposal.
- Carers get 7 min per visit, if they must park considerably further away this will dramatically impact services.

There is no need for these restrictions.

With reference to Harley Place.

There is no through traffic on this street as it is a dead end cul de sac. There is therefore very little traffic indeed on this road and never any issues with access and never any obstruction on Harley Place. I cannot recall ever having difficulty accessing my property due to parked cars or cars in motion. I also have no objection at all to the council worker who parks on the street every day doing so as it causes no issues whatsoever.

Furthermore there has been no increase whatsoever in parked cars on this street, even since the closure of Rodney which was heralded as a threat to our roads and pavements due to displaced gym go-ers. To whom it may concern,

I am writing to object to the proposals to introduce 'No Daytime Waiting' restrictions at Muirton Bank, Florence Place, Harley Place and Harley Terrace in Perth.

Most people parking here do so to use the North Inch, either as a walking corridor into the city or purely for recreation. This should be applauded, removing parking from this area will leave many to cease doing so, effecting their physical and mental health, removing their green space access and causing pollution or congestion elsewhere as they drive deeper into the city to park.

The continual push by Perth and Kinross Council to restrict parking in the City whilst not investing in and improving public transport leaves drivers who need to travel into the City for work with only two options.

- 1. Find parking for which they must pay in the city centre. In a hugely rural county where the majority of people live outside of the city itself this is nothing but a tax on the rural communities, it limits the ability of working families to stay living in the wider Perthshire communities and unfairly penalises them for having to go into the city to find work. At the time of a cost of living crisis money to pay for parking permits is not a feasible option for many and therefore will forced to consider option 2.
- 2. Find work elsewhere and leave Perthshire, further turning the area into a glorified retirement community. To be clear, many people, including myself, do not work 9-5. The dire public transport options in the county make their use simply impossible. This is the cause of the parking issues, not irresponsible drivers. Ultimately therefore parking restrictions of this kind do nothing but damage the economy of the city.

Furthermore the introduction of these measures will

- Limit the options for people to visit friends and relatives in the area
- Disadvantage NHS workers/Carers attending to persons living in the area.
- Prevent trades people carrying our work in the area.
- Limit parking for families to access the play park in North Inch
- Limit parking for persons wishing to undertake recreation on the North inch limiting access to green spaces
- Push cars onto other surrounding streets
- Limit parking for major sporting and cultural events

I trust that PKC will consider a more county wide consultation of the future of transport, parking and travel in general and then consider implementing a strategy to help everyone. The system is broken and urgently needs to be addressed for sure, short sighted measures like this will simply make the problem worse, anger people and will damage the city's economy.



I refer to the above Variation Order in respect of its proposals only for Muirton Bank. On 7 December 2017 my wife and myself wrote in support of the parking restrictions that were being proposed at that time, namely the introduction of waiting restrictions on both sides of Muirton Bank between the hours of 10-11am and 2-3pm

Monday to Friday. I understood the purpose of those restrictions to prevent day long parking by motorists/commuters. Since 2017 parking on Muirton Bank is, in our opinion, much less of a problem. That is likely to be a result of the pandemic as many workers are now working from home and not attending town centre work places daily. The main problem now for parking arises on a Saturday morning when many participants attending the North Inch Park Run park on Muirton Bank, not always with sufficient consideration for home owners trying to drive their cars onto the road. However, this is not a weekly issue and is usually very short in duration. Never the less we do consider that some form of parking management is required. We have no strong opinion as to whether this is achieved by the introduction of a single yellow line on one side only of Muirton Bank or by the marking of individual parking bays or the painting of white lines across individual drive entrances. We do consider, however, that the introduction of yellow lines on both sides of Muirton Bank prohibiting parking between 8am and 6pm from Monday to Sunday is grossly excessive and unnecessary. Accordingly we wish to object to the Variation Order No 24.


I wish to object to the proposal mentioned above which proposes to place "No daytime waiting" restrictions on several streets in the Muirton area including Florence Place.


I strongly object to the above Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 proposed by P&K Council which proposes to implement "No Daytime Waiting" on Muirton Bank, Florence Place, Harley Place and Harley Terrace. In particular, I object to Florence Place being included as it is probably the widest residential street in the area. Cars can be parked on both sides of the street, yet it is still wide enough for 2way traffic to pass easily. I have lived in or 24 years and have never witnessed obstructive parking in the street, even when the Park Run takes place on the nearby North Inch on Saturday mornings. The only people to be affected by the proposed restrictions will be the residents who live on the street. There are a lot of older residents in Florence Place who have grandchildren dropped off and picked up, or have family visiting, and need a park on the street. I notice that Muirton Place and Hay Street which are much narrower streets with cars usually parked there, are not included in the proposed restrictions.

There is usually no room for 2 way traffic to pass and I have regularly had to back up to let oncoming traffic pass safely. The Council need to look at the whole area and they will realise that there is not a problem in Florence Place. It is on a first come, first served basis and I have no problem with that. It is also not a through road so no traffic problems.

Dear Ms Simpson,

I am writing to lodge my objection to this proposed traffic management order.

The TRO would prohibit daytime on-street parking anywhere near my house, and if implemented would potentially mean having to park a considerable distance from here on somebody else's street.

Our house has more vehicles than off-street parking spaces, so for us this inconvenience would be a daily occurrence.

Furthermore, my daughter, who is a foster mother, lives with us and she is constantly dropping off and picking up foster babies with all the equipment and paraphernalia that that involves. This cannot be safely accomplished if she cannot park close to the house.

We also have regular visits from family, social workers, gardener, a carer/cleaner, tradespeople etc, all of whom need to park outside, or very close to our property in Muirton Bank. As do our friends, many of whom are no longer young nor fit.

How we would cope with multiple visitors coming for the weekend or several visitors arriving for a meeting just doesn't bear thinking about.

Further, I have an incurable lung disease and need to go to hospital regularly. In the last 12 months, I have visited PRI and Ninewells over 90 times. As my condition deteriorates, having to park possibly 2-300 yards from the house would become rather more than an inconvenience.

Also at issue is my inability to understand what purpose this order would serve or why it is needed at all. In the proposal the Council offers three reasons for the parking ban, but

1. we already have double yellow lines for visibility at junctions and

2. I have asked around and am unable to learn of any safety problems that need to be addressed outside the Harleys.

This leaves the only reason for inconveniencing a large number of residents and their visitors each and every day is the occassional report of obstructive parking. This sounds rather undemocratic to me.

I accept that I am privileged to live adjacent to one of the finest open spaces in the country, and also accept that the quid pro quo for such a privilege is occasional busy times during events on the Inch, but I can assure you that for all other times parking is not a problem.

We had thought that the move of Live Active Rodney gym to Bells might cause an issue, but here again, there is no evidence of this where I live.


I also feel that the Council should take more consideration of the needs of the wider community. Our wonderful North Inch attracts walkers, runners, cyclists, golfers, sportspeople, children using the playpark and tourists. The real problem for these folk is the lack of parking for the North Inch, and this TPO, if applied, would only make matters worse.




I was given a copy of the order from a neighbour, surely every household in the affected areas should have received a copy of this, not have to rely on a neighbour to get this information.

Furthermore, it is important to consider the broader implications of this proposal on the health and well-being of the residents of Perth. Access to the "inch" is of paramount importance, especially for those fortunate enough to live within close proximity, enabling them to enjoy the area's recreational benefits.

Given the significant and far-reaching impact this proposed parking restriction would have on my family, I kindly request that you reconsider this decision. Your reconsideration would alleviate the immense burden that this restriction would impose on my family and others in similar situations.

I appreciate your attention to this matter and look forward to a favourable resolution that accommodates the unique circumstances of Muirton Bank and its residents.

I am and have lived in this street for over 30 years.



Hello,

I am emailing regarding the notices which have been posted regarding proposing parking restrictions around the roads near North Inch in Perth, including Muirton Bank, Florence Place, Harley Terrace, and Harley Place.

I wish to give my objections to this proposal to the changes.

The proposal notes visibility at junctions, where parking does not extend to a point where it is not possible to navigate, and makes a non-specific reference to road safety and considerate parking. I have only seen people making efforts to park considerately avoiding parking bays, and have seen no indication of undue dangers caused by cars parked on these roads.

Given the number of residents who do not have adequate available parking facilities this could lead to great difficulties for those who live in the area. In addition it would make it very difficult for anyone visiting the area, whether visiting family, caregivers such as district nurses, or event workers such as builders, plumbers etc.

For regular attendees to events at the park, including rugby events and Parkrun events, this would be extremely inconvenient as often there is not enough parking within Bells car park, and it would force people to park further out, merely moving the traffic not eliminating it. For those who just want to take young children to North Inch park for play or exercise it would act as a deterrent if they do not wish to have to travel some distance having travelled to the park.

It is also an area where many parents need to park for a short time for school or nursery drop offs, an inability to park would affect those parents, or the businesses which could suffer from parents not feeling they are able to make safe and timely drop offs.

For those working in town who do not live on an effective public transport route this is one of the few areas within close reach of town where one can park without charge, especially important for those of us working in lower paying roles where daily parking costs would make working within the town centre prohibitively expensive. These lower paying roles are often in areas of customer service or cleaning which could impact both those workers or their employers, and this would seem particularly callous at a time when these are exactly the people being most tightly squeezed by the increasing costs of utilities and the general rising cost of living.

The area is not an accident black spot requiring urgent action, it generally consists of wide roads, and is already within a 20mph zone and with traffic calming measures in place. The proposed changes offer nothing positive to the local residents, visitors, or those using the local amenities.

Please can you ensure that this inconsiderate proposal goes no further.

I am writing this email to ask that you reconsider the proposed parking restrictions at Florence Place, Muirton Bank, Harley Place and Harley Terrace.

The reasons I ask you to consider this are Bells sports Centre car park doesn't always have spaces available if there is an event on at the sports centre, added to that if there is a rugby match on, family's using the play park, dog walkers, users of the sports centre, park run on Saturday mornings plus golfers using the "historic" North Inch golf course. Also the car park will now have additional overload with families who need to park here if they visit friends or family who have no additional parking space at their homes.

As a user of the North inch 2-3 times a week it is a popular space for many local people the park run is well attended every week with 100-200 running most Saturday mornings, The golf course has maybe between 50-100 people playing on it on a Saturday morning alone, plus more in the afternoon. There are also many walkers, dog walkers, boot camps using it all on a Saturday morning! Does the ONE car park in this area have the capacity for all these people plus the others who use the car park to park in all day as it's cheaper than in town?

The North Inch golf course is one of the oldest courses in the world and now the council propose to make it harder for people to get access to the course by making it difficult to get vehicles parked close by. Golf has been played on the Inch for over 500 years, it would be a shame if this decision plays a part in the demise of the course which has had a great turnaround in its fortunes over the last few years.

If the proposed restrictions are passed do the council have any additional parking places in mind that the public can use? or will other streets in surrounding areas be used as an overspill (Balhousie Street, Muirton Place, Hay Street, Malvina place, Malvina Court) I am sure the residents of these streets will soon have something to say if these streets start getting used.

What about local residents of the streets in question who have no off street parking/ or require home help? Are the carers expected to drive around looking for a place to park before they can attend to the resident? As some only get a 15-20 minute visit it could take almost that time to walk from bells to the end of Florence Place!

As an option to go with your proposed restrictions could the double yellow lines not be extended slightly so that the corners are more visible for pedestrians and drivers? Also the access road from Muirton Bank to the Inch could double yellow lines not be placed down one side of the road? I see this as a more viable option that might be a solution, it won't keep everyone happy but you can't please everyone!

# With regard to the proposed parking restrictions on Florence Place and surrounding streets. Variation No, 24 order 202X

As a resident of Florence Place for 27 years I am writing to voice my objection to the proposed ban on parking in Florence Place. I visited Pullar House to discuss the matter with Mr Blair Watt who advised me on the details.

#### The reasons given for restricting the parking on Florence Place are given as:

- "To prevent obstructive parking". In the 27 years that I have lived on Florence Place there has been only one occasion when I had difficulty exiting my drive. This was quickly resolved. This is not an issue as far as I am concerned.
- "Enhance visibility at junctions". The junction between Florence Place and Muirton Bank had double yellow lines painted a number of years ago to provide enhanced visibility at the junctions. Blanket banning of parking is not going to improve the visibility at the junction any more than it is now.
- "Improve road safety for all users". Florence Place now has a 20 mph speed limit. Enforcing this would have a far greater impact on road safety than a mass banning of car parking. Stationary vehicles do not injure cyclists, pedestrians or other road users or inhibit visibility on Florence Place which is a straight road.

Furthermore, if these are the reasons, why is all parking not being banned on Hay Street and Muirton Place (both narrower than Florence Place), as well as Balhousie Street (much busier than Florence Place). The reasons given are generic and could be applied to all residential streets in Perth and Kinross.

#### Terminating the free parking will have consequences for many:

- The community Council indicated to residents incorrectly that free parking permits would be made available. As Perth and Kinross council do not provide residential parking permits unless in a controlled area (as confirmed by Mr Watt) and certainly not free this will limit household parking options. Some in the proposed area have no off road parking at all.
- Limit friends and relatives from visiting or staying over during these hours.
- Prevent/limit trades vans (eg builders, plumbers,gardeners etc) where no off street parking is available.
- Abolish the easy parking availability to parents and children visiting the play park.
- Limit unrestricted parking options for North Inch sporting and cultural events.
- Limit parking options for players on North Inch Golf Course.
- Push more cars to park on Hay Street, Balhousie Street and Muirton Place which are already more congested than Florence Place.
- Paving over front gardens to provide additional parking for residents will inevitably lead to more runoff into the drains, destruction of wildlife habitats and loss of biodiversity. I for example will have to remove a mature 30 year heather bank which is a haven for bees and a multitude of insects to make way for additional parking at my property.

In order to get a better understanding as to why this is being considered we contacted a number of neighbours. None of whom were in favour and didn't know why it was being implemented on Florence Place. Even with vehicles parked down both sides there is ample room for emergency services, delivery vehicles and cars to go up and down.

The North Inch is a beautiful park and I feel privileged to live so close. Free easy access to the park should be available to all without having to struggle to find a parking place. I have no objections to people parking outside my property. Florence Place is the ideal street for people visiting the North Inch for general leisure, Council events, Park Run, volleyball, council workers wishing to walk into work etc. If this facility is removed people will just move elsewhere to narrower less suitable streets or not feel they can go there at all.

To summarise Florence Place does not have a parking or road safety problem. The proposed parking restrictions are totally unnecessary and not required. I have included pictures taken over the last week to illustrate this.



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

i would like to register my objection to the proposed no parking restrictions, No 24 Order 202X.


Personally I think there there adequate parking as long as people park sensibly. Further, I have no objection to people parking in the area and walking into town for work or leisure.

When the parking becomes a problem is when people park inconsiderately, on both sides of the street without leaving enough room to pass, especially for emergency vehicles. There have been several occasions where the police have had to be called to allow cars into the street because of inconsiderate parking and my wife and I have often remarked that a fire engine probably couldn't get through. Happily that hasn't happened yet, but there is every chance it could.

I am of the view that double yellow lines along one side of Muirton Bank would be enough as it would leave one side of the road clear and still allow parking for friends, health care workers, tradesmen, gardeners, park runners and golfers alike.

I believe the proposed restrictions will make it hard for residents to be able to engage tradesmen, and given there are many elderly residents, difficulty in accessing the street for landscape gardeners will be a significant problem.

Inevitably it will also just push those who park here one or two more streets further out and not really solve anything. Perhaps the council should instead be looking at reducing parking charges in the town centre to encourage more people into the town and reinvigorate a failing space.





Further to your advertisement on 29<sup>th</sup> September in the local media I'm writing to fully support the introduction of single yellow lines restricting parking from 0800 to 1800 Monday to Sunday on the streets outlined on the plan for Ward 12.

As a long term resident I've found that vehicles are often parked so close to my drive that I either can't get my car or Motorhome out, or, get back into my property without significant difficulty. In the last 6 months I've had to raise an incident with Police Scotland on two occasions regarding motor vehicles causing an obstruction. The two Police Scotland incident numbers are and On one of these occasions the car was illegal and dumped outside my house with no MOT or Vehicle licence for 10 days before the police found the owner and got the car removed. I personally don't think that out very over-stretched police resources should have to be frequently dealing with resident parking issues.

One another occasion in the last few months I have also to endure verbal abuse from a car owner who parked her car in a position that could have caused a potential incident, on being challenged about why she would leave her car in such a vulnerable position, she replied "there are no yellow lines so I can park where I want "as well as a few other unfavourable comments in my direction. On the day of writing, a car has been parked outside my house since Monday morning, the gentleman parked the car, took a suitcase out of the boot and the car is still there on Thursday lunchtime, it is also causing me issues getting out of my property.

The average age of many residents in Muirton Bank is quite high, most of them are car owners and car users, it is totally unacceptable that these residents have to endure problems accessing and egressing their properties because of these ongoing parking issues. In addition there are many instances where other residents who a law abiding citizens are suffering from verbal abuse.

Service vehicles, emergency vehicles and logistics companies are all also experiencing difficulties with through travel on Muirton Bank due to the volume of cars parked on the street.

These parking issues have constantly been raised with P&KC since I moved to the street about 15 years ago and nothing apart from what Mr D Duncan(P&KC) called the "Phase 1" work in 2015 has changed , the P&KC "promised" Phase 2 work has never materialised. The Ward 12 councillors (4 off) have never changed in all the time that the parking issues have been an issue despite promises from them individually and collectively of action on behalf of the residents of the affected streets. I sincerely hope on this occasion that they do uphold their previous commitments.





At last - it's been a long time coming!

The first meetings to deal with obstructive parkers in the North Inch area was around 2016. Even at this time there was a clear wish for parking restrictions to be introduced. I'm glad that the Community Council supported by our local Councillors have worked to push forward the implementation of parking restrictions.

Since 2016, obstructive parking issues have increased including issues from day commuters, weekly commuters, golfers and Bells Sport Centre attendees. People park wherever they can get space and on a few occasions police have been called to allow residents to get out of their driveway to get to work. There have also been regular issues with bin lorries unable to access Harley Terrace for weekly collections. Due to the demographic of the area there has also been major concern that emergency services would be unable to access houses.





# Consultation – Yellow Lines – North Inch Area

I'm writing in response to the above consultation to support the implementation of single yellow lines in the named streets from 8 am to 6 pm.

This residential area, with no current restrictions, is used as a free car park mostly by commuters, but also non-residents storing vehicles here for weeks at a time, taxis etc. At the weekends, with sporting events nearby and no dedicated parking for them, we again find ourselves inundated.

Without restrictions, vehicles are parked wherever there's a space and without concern for those of us who live here, who then get shouted at for remonstrating. This results in vehicles being parked over drives, residents' vehicles being damaged and regular traffic churn as more drivers look for parking, see photo below of restricted egress from my drive just last week.

If we're blocked in, our only option at this time is to call the Police but given the Police have plenty of other calls on their time it's not a sensible use of resources. We also can't get our streets swept as there's vehicles parked everywhere and delivery vans and lorries are required to make repeated attempts to deliver.

This problem has been growing for years and, as our area is now the only sizeable free car parking space near central Perth, it's well known. This reduces parking revenue for P&KC where metered parking bays and car parks closer to town are left half empty. It also denies business to other operators where, for example, it's £2 for a day's parking at Tesco, or £4 per day at Morrisons supermarket. So there are alternatives available but without an element of 'carrot and stick' multi-modal change won't happen and that militates against Government policy to reduce miles travelled by 20%.


There have been a few attempts at implementing restrictions for about 15 years but each has been unsuccessful, so I really hope changes will be made this time. For those who fear that nuisance parking will be moved elsewhere, then you need to DEAL with that. What's happening here today is because nuisance parking has been moved from elsewhere but it's just been left till the problem gets worse and worse again. This time, please sort it.

For all of the above reasons I fully support yellow lines restrictions and as I know that Roads (Daryl McKeown) agreed to evaluate the effects of the yellows after a number of months, any unintended consequences can be identified and dealt with.







# Letter in support of Parking Restrictions for Harley Place, Harley Terrace & Muirton Bank

Who am I? 
My husband and I have lived here for 38 years.

Why do I want Parking Restrictions: -

I want parking restrictions to be brought in here because the standard of parking has got very bad in recent years. People just dump their vehicles where they want with no thought for the homeowners. the Homeowner at #5 regularly has people parking vans on the pavement blocking her from even getting out of her gate. On Saturday mornings, I don't even try to get my car out because it's so difficult.

This never happened in the past – people had an element of a clue but now it is just to make the distance from their vehicle to the Clubhouse as short as possible even though they are about the walk another 3 miles or more during their round of golf.

Vans – vans should be banned from entering the street unless they are here to work or to deliver goods. Vans cause problems with their width - their owners think they are doing the right thing by parking on the pavement. How do they expect mothers pushing prams, people in wheelchairs, the elderly in the area etc to get up and down the street? Use the road?

The main part of this problem is the width of the street. The street was built in the 1930s in an era when there were not huge wide vehicles like we have today. Wide vehicles cause us huge problems.

Blocking drives – sadly this is not uncommon. We had the ludicrous situation last year when one of the ladies in the street was blocked in by the inconsiderate parking by a guy walking his dog. This particular lady happens to be an A&E nurse at Ninewells and had to get to work but could not get her car out of her drive. The Police had to be brought in to resolve things. Dog walkers are not exempt from general bad parking – they are, if anything, worse at parking than the Golf Club members.

The turning circle at the bottom of Harley Terrace is regularly (every Saturday and most Fridays) parked over so nobody could use it to turn if they wanted to – also, at the same area, people sadly park over the entrance to the path to the North Inch blocking wheelchair & pram access. They just don't care where they park as long as it is as close to the Golf Club as humanly possible. This includes pavement parking in the area around the Car Park – not in the actual Car Park itself but close to it so it looks like they tried when being realistic they just didn't bother.

In short, I support Parking Restrictions for better health (less car pollution), less noise pollution from cars revving engines (does happen sometimes!) and also safer streets for the infirm and elderly (instead of wheelchairs etc being forced to use the streets due to bad parking) along with the various other things mentioned above.




Further to your advertisement on 29<sup>th</sup> September in the local media I'm writing to fully support the introduction of single yellow lines restricting parking from 0800 to 1800 Monday to Sunday on the streets outlined on the plan for Ward 12.

As a long term resident I've found that vehicles are often parked so close to my drive that I either can't get my car or Motorhome out, or, get back into my property without significant difficulty. In the last 6 months I've had to raise an incident with Police Scotland on two occasions regarding motor vehicles causing an obstruction. The two Police Scotland incident numbers are and On one of these occasions the car was illegal and dumped outside my house with no MOT or Vehicle licence for 10 days before the police found the owner and got the car removed. I personally don't think that out very over-stretched police resources should have to be frequently dealing with resident parking issues.

One another occasion in the last few months I have also to endure verbal abuse from a car owner who parked her car in a position that could have caused a potential incident, on being challenged about why she would leave her car in such a vulnerable position, she replied "there are no yellow lines so I can park where I want "as well as a few other unfavourable comments in my direction. On the day of writing, a car has been parked outside my house since Monday morning, the gentleman parked the car, took a suitcase out of the boot and the car is still there on Thursday lunchtime, it is also causing me issues getting out of my property.

The average age of many residents in Muirton Bank is quite high, most of them are car owners and car users, it is totally unacceptable that these residents have to endure problems accessing and egressing their properties because of these ongoing parking issues. In addition there are many instances where other residents who a law abiding citizens are suffering from verbal abuse.

Service vehicles, emergency vehicles and logistics companies are all also experiencing difficulties with through travel on Muirton Bank due to the volume of cars parked on the street.

These parking issues have constantly been raised with P&KC since I moved to the street about 15 years ago and nothing apart from what Mr D Duncan(P&KC) called the "Phase 1" work in 2015 has changed , the P&KC "promised" Phase 2 work has never materialised. The Ward 12 councillors (4 off) have never changed in all the time that the parking issues have been an issue despite promises from them individually and collectively of action on behalf of the residents of the affected streets. I sincerely hope on this occasion that they do uphold their previous commitments.

In summary, I fully support this initiative and hope that we have the yellow lines as per the plan installed before the end of 2023.

Thank you for your email responding to the consultation for Perth Traffic Management Order Vo 24 regarding proposed Limited Waiting Restrictions in the Muirton Bank area. Details of the proposal can be seen in the attached plan.

In total, 136 responses were received with 102 objections, 23 in support and 11 responses asking for similar measures in neighbouring streets. A summary of all of the responses were sent to the Ward 12 Elected Members for their consideration on how they wish to proceed.

Following discussion with the Ward 12 members, I can confirm that a report will be submitted to the Environment, Infrastructure and Economic Development Committee. The report will recommend the Committee considers the objections and set aside objections to allow the Traffic Regulation Order to be made in partial to promote the Limited Waiting Restrictions Harley Place, Harley Terrace and No Waiting at Any Time restrictions on the Access Road. Following the objections, the limited waiting restrictions on Muirton Bank and Florence Place are recommended to be withdraw. The report will include summarised version of your response and the full response, with personal information redacted, will be included as an appendix.

I appreciate that this may not be the recommendation that you would have hoped for. We live in Perth and are responding to your consultation about yellow lines.

We have had occasional problems in this very narrow street for many years, particularly at the weekends. Drivers who tend not to be residents sometimes inconsiderately park their vehicles in any available space, blocking in residents so that they cannot exit their drives or make it very difficult and dangerous for them to do so. We are also aware of incidents where our neighbours have faced verbal abuse when they have politely requested that vehicles be moved only a few feet to allow access to/from driveways.

Bin lorries regularly cannot access the terrace and refuse operatives end up having to pull bins out to Harley Place or Muirton Bank in order to empty them into the lorry. Vehicles are often part-parked on pavements making it difficult for pedestrians to pass safely, especially for anyone using a push chair or a mobility scooter. If emergency services should ever need to access the terrace at times when there are large volumes of parked vehicles on the terrace, we

have genuine concerns as to how they would quickly access residents and properties.


Consequently, the planned yellow lines are very welcome in our view and we hope that they will be brought into effect without any further unnecessary delay.


I reside in Florence Place, Perth, PH1 5BH.



The yellow lines are a welcome development in this area and a permit system for residents with no offstreet parking is important too. I hope these can go ahead soon.



## 1. PURPOSE

1.1 The purpose of this report is to present the updated Delivery Programme which supports the adopted Perth & Kinross Local Development Plan 2 (LDP2). It also seeks approval for the adoption, publication and submission of the Programme to Scottish Ministers.

## 2. RECOMMENADTIONS

- 2.1 It is recommended that the Committee:
  - adopts the Delivery Programme as set out in Appendix 1;
  - ii) requests the Executive Director of Communities to publish and submit the Delivery Programme to Scottish Ministers.

## 4. BACKGROUND

- 4.1 Perth & Kinross Local Development Plan 2 (LDP2) was formally adopted by the Council on 29 November 2019. It sets out a vision to promote Perth and Kinross as a sustainable, more attractive, competitive, and vibrant region. A copy of LDP2 is available online at: <a href="https://www.pkc.gov.uk/ldp2">www.pkc.gov.uk/ldp2</a>
- 4.2 The Planning etc. (Scotland) Act 2006, as amended by the Planning (Scotland) Act 2019, requires planning authorities to prepare a delivery programme to accompany the local development plan. A delivery programme sets out how the authority proposes to implement the plan to which it relates.

The delivery programme must be reviewed once a plan is adopted and republished at least every two years. Ongoing discussions with stakeholders and delivery partners is expected to inform reviews of the delivery programme. Each time the delivery programme is re-published, the Council must send two copies to Scottish Ministers, place copies in local libraries and publish it electronically.

## 5. PROPOSALS AND NEXT STEPS

# **Local Development Planning Guidance**

- 5.1 Since the delivery programme was last updated in 2022 (report no. 22/27 refers), the Scottish Government has published new <u>Guidance</u> on preparing LDPs and associated documents, including the LDP delivery programme. The Local Development Planning Guidance sets out an enhanced role for delivery programmes including
  - the delivery programme is as important a part of the package as the LDP itself and represents a firm commitment to delivering the LDP;
  - the delivery programme is part of the project management toolkit, helping focus resources on delivery as well as plan-making;
  - the preparation of the delivery programme is to be considered at the outset of LDP preparation and run alongside it; and
  - the delivery programme should be considered akin to a business plan for the implementation of the LDP and is a corporate document to help achieve the Council's priorities.
- 5.2 Paragraph 201 of the Guidance states that, ideally, a delivery programme should:
  - clearly indicate how sites are prioritised;
  - specify actions and timescales to delivery sites, including any interventions required, and identifying any costs and constraints and a clear pathway to addressing them e.g. funding sources, timescales / phasing;
  - specify how, and when, developer contributions will be sought, collected and become available over time to support the delivery of the development;
  - establish a deliverable housing land pipeline for the Local Housing Land Requirement;
  - identify a pathway to delivery for longer term allocations; and
  - the annual housing land audit will monitor the delivery of housing land to inform the pipeline and the actions to be taken in the delivery programme.
- 5.3 The Guidance states that once the initial delivery programme is prepared, there are no legislative requirements as to how the reviewing or updating process is to be carried out.

5.4 This represents a significantly bigger role for the delivery programme than the previous LDP Action Programme, which was more focussed on monitoring progress. Work has already started on LDP3 and, noted in paragraph 5.1, the development of the delivery programme for LDP3 will be integrated with the preparation of the Plan itself. Given that it is now more than four years since LDP2 was adopted, it is considered that trying to retrospectively prepare a new-style delivery programme for this Plan would be extremely challenging and resource-intensive. It would also significantly impact on planning officers' ability to resource the preparation of the new programme for LDP3, and adhere to the timeline for publication of the Evidence Report approved by the EI&ED Committee on 1 November 2023 (report no. 23/288 refers). It is, therefore, considered reasonable and proportionate to update the LDP2 delivery programme along similar lines to that which has been done previously. This will mean elected members and the public can be updated on the delivery progress of LDP2 policies and sites, without taking staff resource away from the more significant process which will be the LDP3 delivery programme.

# **Delivery strategies**

- 5.5 As reported in the previous update, LDP2 included a new policy 23: Delivery of Development Sites. This policy requires the landowner and / or developer of each allocated site, and of larger windfall sites, to prepare a delivery strategy which demonstrates a realistic programme for delivery through the Plan period and beyond. Delivery strategies are to be updated on a 6 monthly basis to inform the LDP Delivery Programme.
- Planning officers have been maintaining contact with landowners and developers and have been requesting delivery strategy updates as required by the LDP policy. This has been especially useful in feeding into the Delivery Programme update and the annual Housing Land Audit. Unfortunately, however, there are still a small number of allocated sites (less than 10) for which no response has been received. These are mostly employment, mixed use, or opportunity sites. Efforts will continue to be made to contact landowners and / or developers of these sites until such time as they are reviewed through the next LDP.
- 5.7 The delivery strategy process has been particularly useful in helping build relationships between Development Plan officers and landowners / developers, and a key benefit has been to help identify those sites where the Council should be seeking to take a more proactive role. The process is also helping to identify those sites which should be considered for removal from the next Plan. As such, Development Plan officers will continue to engage with landowners and / or developers through the delivery strategy process to inform both the LDP2 Delivery Programme and the next LDP.

## 6. CONCLUSION

6.1 The LDP2 Delivery Programme (Appendix 1) sets out the actions required to ensure the successful implementation of policies and proposals contained within the Plan and indicates who will be responsible for delivering these. While Local Development Planning Guidance sets out an enhanced role for delivery programmes going forward, it is considered appropriate for Perth & Kinross Council to focus on updating the LDP2 Delivery Programme along previous lines. This will allow work to also begin timeously on the delivery programme for LDP3. Once approved, this will be sent to Scottish Ministers and published as the guidance outlines.

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## Introduction

The Delivery Programme 2019-2029 - 7 February 2024 update has been prepared to support the delivery of the Perth & Kinross Local Development Plan 2 (LDP2). It sets out the actions and partnerships required to implement the Plan and will serve as a tool to achieve this purpose.

To ensure the efficient and effective delivery of LDP2 it is important that any actions or infrastructure development required are identified as soon as possible to provide confidence to key stakeholders, developers and funders.

The Delivery Programme has been prepared with input from other departments within Perth & Kinross Council, key stakeholders, the Scottish Government and other organisations and delivery bodies specified in the document. Perth & Kinross Council aspires to build on this version of the Delivery Programme with regular reviews and communication with stakeholders.

Funding of a number of the schemes contained with the Delivery Programme will be dependent on future Scottish Government spending reviews and the availability of public and private sector finance.

# **Background**

The Planning etc. (Scotland) Act 2006, as amended by the Planning (Scotland) Act 2019, requires a local planning authority to publish a Delivery Programme to accompany the Local Development Plan.

LDP2 was formally adopted by the Council on 29 November 2019. The first Delivery Programme 2019-29 in support of the Plan was adopted by the Council in January 2020 and thereafter was published and submitted to Scottish Ministers. The Programme was updated on 2 Feburary 2022.

# **Approach**

The delivery of proposals and policies is a complex process that requires a pragmatic approach to delivery. In considering the delivery of sites, the expectations of all parties should remain realistic, and the requirements remain as flexible as possible to ensure the delivery is viable. While all the strategic, national and regional development actions from National Planning Framework 4, the Strategic Transport Projects Review 2 (STPR), and the Tactran Regional Transport Strategy (RTS) Refresh 2015-2036 and RTS Delivery Plan 2016-2021 (and the RTS2 currently under preparation) are important, only some will have a direct impact on the delivery of LDP2.

# **Delivery and Monitoring**

Strong leadership and stakeholder commitment are key to the successful delivery of the Delivery Programme. The Local Development Planning Guidance requires Planning Authorities to consult with and consider the views of the key agencies and the Scottish Ministers. The Guidance also highlights the important and complementary roles of the Delivery Programme and the annual Housing Land Audit in the delivery of LDPs.

This version of the Delivery Programme takes into account any progress which has been made on individual site proposals and policies since the Delivery Programme update in February 2022.

# **Future Delivery Programmes**

There is a requirement under LDP2 Policy 23: Delivery of Development Sites, for a Delivery Strategy to be prepared and updated every 6 months for sites allocated for development in the Plan. The Delivery Strategy is to demonstrate a realistic programme for the delivery of the site through the plan period and beyond. Several rounds of engagement on Delivery Strategies have been undertaken since the first round in March 2021 and the outcomes of these have informed this version of the Delivery Programme. The preparation of a full strategy for every allocated site is a work in progress and these will continue to be incorporated into future versions of the Delivery Programme.

# Report by Strategic Lead – Environment & Infrastructure (Report No. 24/52)

### 1. PURPOSE

1.1 The purpose of this report is to seek elected members comments and subsequent approval to the draft response to the Scottish Government's consultation on water, wastewater and drainage.

### 2. RECOMMENDATIONS

- 2.1 It is recommended that Committee:
  - comments on the draft consultation officer response as set out at Appendix A.
  - requests the Executive Director (Communities) to submit the Council's response, taking into account the comments of this Committee.

### 4. BACKGROUND / MAIN ISSUES

- 4.1 The Scottish Government has issued a consultation (Appendix 1), which seeks views on how the water industry needs to adapt to the impacts of the climate emergency. The policy proposals are designed to
  - protect water, wastewater and drainage services;
  - better understand the impacts of climate change on these services; and,
  - maximise the benefits that can be delivered for the people of Scotland.
- 4.2 In March 2022, the Scottish Government's Climate Change Committee (CCC) set out a series of recommendations in its independent assessment,

"Is Scotland climate ready? 2022 Report to Scottish Parliament Recommendations (theccc.org.uk)".

In this report, the CCC identified key areas where Scotland could make improvements to better adapt to the impacts of climate change.

- 4.3 In the letter attached as Appendix 1 to this report, the Scottish Government have considered how to address the risks highlighted and the recommendations made by the Climate Change Committee. These are set out as choices that Scotland needs to consider in adapting and evolving to the impacts of climate change. In addition to this consultation, the Scottish Government will be consulting on a new Scottish National Adaptation Plan later in the year. This will set out a wider response to the risks set out across the natural, coastal and marine environments, communities, public services and businesses. The letter also includes a link to the consultation which is the subject of this report. Ourdraft response is contained within Appendix 2.
- 4.4 The Scottish Government have stated that the outcome of this consultation could inform potential changes to legislation. This would reflect the views collected from the public and other stakeholders about how water, wastewater and drainage services need to adapt to the impacts of climate change, including increased temperatures, drought and more intense rainfall. The covering letter to local authorities about the consultation outlines the following points within the paragraphs below.
- 4.5 The Scottish Government recognise that there is a need to ensure that there is a reliable supply of water during dry periods and act to protect the water supplies quickly during these times. Whilst most of Scotland is served by a public supply of water, there are some homes across Scotland that have private water supplies, which are especially vulnerable. There is a need to make sure that they are protected in the same way that public supplies are. Across Perth and Kinross, there are more than 3000 private water supplies.
- 4.6 Members will be acutely aware that Scotland, including Perth and Kinross, is also seeing more extreme weather events such as periods of very heavy and/or intense rainfall, which can lead to spills from drainage systems to the environment and/or cause flooding to homes and businesses. It is recognised, therefore, that greater changes are required in the way the consequences of extreme weather events are managed as their frequency increases across the country as a whole.
- 4.7 There is a greater need to better plan and fund drainage services and infrastructure to be able to cope with more rainwater through the integrated drainage of roofs and roads. The Scottish Government believe that there is a need to ensure that the drainage of rainwater separately from wastewater is seen as a vital service that is planned for when consideration is given to how land should be used. Consideration is also needed regarding how we can bring blue-green infrastructure into existing communities by making the best of our existing greenspace whether they are small or large to help manage rainwater. All opportunities also need to be taken to bring in new blue-green

- infrastructure and reduce our hard surfaces, for example, by introducing rain gardens at the street scale and replacing paved areas such as driveways with permeable surfaces.
- 4.8 Green and blue infrastructure is the network of natural and semi-natural areas, features and spaces that lie within and between our towns and cities and which provide multiple social, economic and environmental benefits. Included are 'green' features such as parks, woodlands, street trees, wildlife habitats, and allotments along with 'blue' features such as rivers, wetlands, ponds and SuDS features. These are best connected by habitat corridors, and active access routes such as core paths, rights of way and long distance routes. Further information can be found in our Supplementary Guidance GI Supplementary Guidance Adopted.pdf (pkc.gov.uk)
- 4.9 Any new infrastructure to collect and manage rainwater will need to be delivered efficiently, effectively and designed and built to drain both new developments and existing urban areas. To do this, the Scottish Government recognise that they need to be planned and built in partnership with local authorities, Scottish Water, developers, landowners, communities and other partners. This approach also needs to ensure that they are operated and maintained so they continue to work properly over the long term.

### 5. PROPOSALS

5.1 The Council's proposed response to the consultation is set out in Appendix 2. Elected Members comments are sought on the response. These will be reflected within the Council's submission by 21 February 2024.

### 6. CONCLUSION

6.1 The Scottish Government has issued a consultation on water, wastewater and drainage and how the water industry needs to respond in the light of climate change. It is important that the Council provide a response as this could inform future legislation. Officers have drafted answers to the consultation questions and a draft response for elected members' consideration and approval is contained within Appendix 2.

For the development of our new build Council housing and Council housing refurbishment programmes we have recently developed a new Design Guide. This guide outlines best practice in developing suitable, affordable and energy efficient housing design. The Guide incorporates a range of recommended features which will ensure new build homes and refurbishment programmes meet the individual needs of each household, and are well connected to local services, jobs, and communities.

Within the Design Guide there are some elements in relation to the management of rainwater and that the drainage design is listed as having to reference the following guidance:

- Scottish Water guidelines
- PKC Flood Risk Supplementary Guidance
- PKC Open Space Provision for New developments

The Guide states that the sustainable drainage is to be integrated within site layouts, streets and gardens. Preference is to capture all volume above ground but if this is not achievable then a combination of below ground storage tanks and oversized pipes with above ground strategies will offer an acceptable solution. Drainage should ensure that flows directed away from homes with road surfaces kept lower than verges, footpaths and homes where possible.

Developments should incorporate landscape features to support sustainable drainage such as rain gardens and swales (shallow drainage channels). These can provide opportunities within communities by supporting growing spaces, providing pleasant green zones and spaces for children to play and learn.

In terms of driveways, we currently don't build any properties with driveways but instead provide communal parking areas; as the drainage is to be integrated at the time of the build, the capacity should be considered in the design at the time of the proposals being developed.

# Question 20

Do you have any further views on how Scotland should manage rainwater in the future?

Please give us your views.

The recent policy framework developments around blue-green infrastructure enhanced the existing flood risk management approach but are unlikely to dramatically reduce surface water flood risk.

While blue-green infrastructure has its place and can play a limited role in future rainwater management, it will not provide solutions in built-up urban catchments at the highest risk of surface water flooding where little or no space is available. In such circumstances, all other potential solutions must continue to be pursued (surface water management planning, SUDS, Scottish water improvements in combined sewer infrastructure, etc). Grey infrastructure solutions will therefore remain necessary.

While the aspiration of separating surface water out of combined sewers is understood, the surface water and resulting flood risk still has to be managed.

There remain many barriers to the delivery of effective surface water flood management including:

- Limited funding:-
  - Surface water management schemes are often not economically viable and therefore do not attract capital grant funding; the Scottish Government should consider changes to existing legislation to address this.
  - Capital grant funding levels should be increased to meet the needs of the climate emergency.
  - At present Scottish Water are only funded to deal with internal property sewer flooding. They should be provided with funding to deal with internal and external property surface water flooding.
- The current regulatory/legislative framework around surface water flood risk management should be reviewed and strengthened, particularly with a view to placing greater duties on Scottish Water.
- A legal duty should be placed on Scottish Water to manage internal and external property flooding due to surface water, as well as internal sewer flooding.
- Sustainable Urban Drainage Systems:-
  - Legal duties should be placed on developers to provide well designed, natural SUDS. This should be back up by Changes to Sewers for Scotland.
  - Additional Regulations should be considered to improve the design, adoption and maintenance arrangements for SUDs.
- Landowners and farmers must act to reduce surface water runoff from private and agricultural land as this makes a significant contribution to flood risk, and the transport of significant volumes of sediment.
