1. PURPOSE

1.1 The report asks Aberfeldy Common Good Fund Committee to consider one small grant application.

4. BACKGROUND / MAIN ISSUES

- 4.1 Perth and Kinross Council owns land and property which forms part of the Common Good of the former burghs in Perth and Kinross and has a statutory duty in terms of section 15 of the Local Government etc. (Scotland) Act 1994 to administer this land and property "having regard to the interests of the inhabitants" of those former burghs. This duty also applies to the administration of the associated Common Good Funds.
- 4.2 The Common Good Funds have traditionally demonstrated their support to local residents and organisations by distributing grants. These grant awards allow individuals and local organisations to carry out a wide range of community-based activities.
- 4.3 Applications to Common Good Funds vary across the different former burghs of Perth and Kinross. Applications to Common Good Funds vary across the different former burghs of Perth and Kinross. This report is for the Aberfeldy Common Good Fund.

4.4 The estimated income for financial year 2024/25, and the value of the application to be considered at this meeting, is summarised below:

5. PROPOSALS - SMALL GRANTS

Breadalbane Academy

- 5.1 A grant of £500 has been requested from Breadalbane Academy. The grant will help to support a group pupils undertake an excursion to Poland, to learn about the history and legacy of the Holocaust. The excursion will visit the location of the Krakow Ghetto, the location of Oscar Schindler's factory, and Auschwitz Concentration Camp. There would also be the opportunity to meet and talk to a first-generation Holocaust survivor. The excursion is taking place from 1-4 June 2024, and it is estimated that 10 young people from the Common Good Area will benefit from this project, along with 14 young people from elsewhere in Perth & Kinross.
- 5.2 The total cost for this project estimated at £15,312. This is based on a package quote for the entire trip. The group are requesting £500 from Aberfeldy Common Good Fund. They have received funding of £5,000 from the Basil Death Fund and Taymouth Castle. The remaining costs will be met by school fundraising and pupil contributions A full breakdown of the total costs is provided below.
