CORPORATE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE BUDGET

Executive Director (Environment)

PURPOSE OF REPORT

The report seeks approval for the payment of applications to the Council's Corporate Financial Assistance Budget made in the current financial year.

1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The Corporate Financial Assistance budget is currently used to provide financial support to voluntary / community organisations. The funding criteria, previously approved by the Committee, is intended to be "investment focused" in supporting the building of community capacity through investment in growth and development and investment in grass-roots activities.
- 1.2 The Corporate Financial Assistance Budget totals £122,000 in 2015/16 and sits under the responsibility of the Executive Director (Environment).
- 1.3 Of the total budget of £122,000, £5,000 is required to meet the cost of administration in the current year with the remaining £117,000 available to support grant applications.
- 1.4 Following a re-structuring of the Corporate Financial Assistance Budget in 2014/15 to transfer funding for major grant awards to Services (Report 14/169 refers), the Executive Director (Environment) has instructed a review of the governance arrangements for the Corporate Financial Assistance Budget. The recommendations arising from this review will be reported to the Committee at its meeting in September.
- 1.5 Pending approval of the review, the Executive Director (Environment) has authorised, under delegated authority, grant payments to local village hall committees and in-bloom groups totalling £18,400 in 2015/16. This leaves a net £98,600 available for distribution in 2015/16.

2. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE APPLICATIONS RECEIVED IN 2015/16

- 2.1 As at 1 July 2015, 17 applications for Financial Assistance funding have been received in the current financial year. These are summarised in Appendix 1 to the report together with details of any payments made from this budget to the same organisations in the previous two financial years.
- 2.2 An application from the Pitlochry Pavilion User Group has subsequently been identified as being intended for consideration under the Community Environmental Challenge Fund and is not included in Appendix 1.

- 2.3 An application has been received from Kinross-shire Partnership. Highland Perthshire Communities Partnership have also intimated an intention to submit an application for funding. It is, therefore, proposed to defer consideration of applications from community partnerships until such time as these applications may be considered together in consultation with Elected Members from the localities concerned.
- 2.4 It is recommended that consideration of the application from Friends of Stanley Primary School for the creation of a trim trail be deferred pending the conclusion of discussions with Education & Children's Services on the proposal.
- 2.5 It is recommended that consideration of the application from Stand Easy in relation to theatre skills for ex Service personnel be deferred pending consultation with the Council's Armed Forces And Veterans Champion.
- 2.6 Recommended levels of funding to applicant organisations are set out for consideration by the Sub-Committee in Appendix 1 to the report. The recommendations are based upon the approved funding criteria and levels of funding provided in 2014/15. The recomendations in respect of the applications set out in Appendix 1 total £16,162.
- 2.7 Local Elected Members have not been consulted in advance in the preparation of this report. It is, therefore, recommended that all applications for Financial Assistance in 2015/16 approved by the Sub-Committee be subject to consultation with and the agreement of Elected Members in the localities concerned.

3. CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATION

- 3.1 The Executive Sub-Committee is requested to approve:
 - (i) The award of grant funding in 2015/16 from the Corporate Financial Assistance Budget totalling £16,162 as detailed in Appendix 1 to the report.
 - (ii) That all such awards are subject to consultation with and the agreement of Elected Members in the localities concerned.
